## DIFFERENCE BETWEEN STATE AND GOVERNMENT

- **The state** is a form of political entity by which a society is organized under an agency of **government** which claims legitimate sovereignty over specified geographical area.
- The state is the sovereign political organization of the individuals occupying a definite territory.
- Government is the formal organization that has the legal and political authority to regulate relationships among members of a society and between the society and those outside its borders.

### WHAT IS A WELFARE STATE?

- Every country call herself a welfare state but the level of welfare services vary from society to society.
- Welfare states are as varied as the nations in which they exist. e.g.
- The expansive and comprehensive social welfare system of Sweden differs from that of minimal and need-based provision of services of the USA.
- Traditionally, Germany has always had a much more generous type of welfare benefits to its people. Now it wants to cut welfare benefits but there is a problem; how to avoid the response of its angry citizens

#### THE WELFARE STATE

- A welfare state is a state which provides for its citizens a wide range of social services in such areas as unemployment, medicine, education and housing.
- The term refers to those societies where the <u>government</u> has assumed the <u>responsibility for the</u> <u>wellbeing of the citizens</u> and that this <u>cannot be</u> <u>entrusted to the individual</u>, private corporations, or local <u>community</u>.

#### WELFARE STATE?

- The form of government in which the state plays a key role in the protection and promotion of the economic and social well-being of its citizens.
- It is based on the principles of <u>equality</u> of opportunity, equitable distribution of wealth, and public responsibility for those unable to attain minimal provisions for a good life.



- The "welfare state" often refers to an ideal model of provision, where the state accepts responsibility for the provision of comprehensive and universal welfare for its citizens.
- A state which actively participates in securing and promoting the economic welfare of its citizens.

#### **Functions of the Welfare State**

Though it is very difficult to prepare a fixed list of the functions of the Welfare State, yet the functions of the state can be divided into two categories such as:



#### **Compulsory Functions**

- Protection of life and property
- Maintenance of Law and Order
- Welfare; The state initiates policies and programmes for the welfare of its citizens.
- Protection from Foreign Invasions
- Establishment of Diplomatic Relations with other States
- Providing Justice to the People

### **Optional Functions**

- Socialization
- Evaluation of other institutions
- To Make Regulations Regarding Trade and Industries
- To Make Regulations regarding Export and Import
- Imposition and Collection of Taxes
- Protection of Environment and Development of natural resources
- Protection of the Interests of Labourers
- To Provide Recreational Facilities
