Executive Summary

University of Peshawar took another step forward under the light of its core values, in pursuit to be a prominent public sector university in the region recognized for its global perspective, diverse and supportive learning environment, having international reputation in research and creative discovery and emphasis on leadership development.

The university strives to provide maximum access to higher education to the students. During the year, the overall enrollment of the University was 1,04,479. Out of the total enrolment 10,018 were at undergraduate level, 59,064 at graduate, 34,181 at post-graduate, 725 at M.Phil., and 491 at Ph.D. level.

In order to provide opportunities for the enhancement of qualifications of existing faculty members to Ph.D. or equivalent and to increase number of faculty members having advanced qualifications in fields of relevance, University of Peshawar extends full as well as partial assistance to its faculty members for higher studies.

University of Peshawar encourages and supports each and every one of its faculty members. They are provided opportunities to build their capacity in diverse areas, from subject knowledge to teaching methodologies and communication skills. This is achieved through organization and participation in seminars, workshops, conferences, trainings and study tours, national as well as international ones. The faculty is also encouraged to develop knowledge repositories in the form of local, national and international research publications.

Faculty of the University has been involved in building their capacity in diverse areas, from subject knowledge to teaching methodologies and communication skills. The purpose was achieved by organizing and participating in 291 conferences, seminars and workshops etc. In addition, a total of 59 trainings were received and / or imparted, both at national as well as international level.

University of Peshawar has been strengthening academic and research linkages as well as creating new ones with institutions both national and international. New Memoranda of Understandings have been signed with six international institutions while four are under process. Similarly linkages with four national institutions have also been established.

Teacher's research projects, to the tune of Rs. 6.181 million were funded from University's budget and Rs. 1.830 million by HEC. Apart from that the HEC has provided a total of Rs. 7.974 million for miscellaneous activities.

The University assessed 84809 students in the overall examinations comprizing of M.A. / MSc., B.A. / B.Sc, MBBS, BDS, BHMS, and other professional examinations in 2005-06.

During the year development projects worth Rs. 110.143 million have been completed. Projects worth Rs. 808.911 million are in in the pipeline and projects worth Rs. 511.764 million were approved with the kind support of the Higher Education Commission.

Recently established Quality Enhancement Cell is actively engaged in activities leading towards the achievement of institutional quality. One of the major activities was the initiation of Self-assessment Process under the Self Assessment Model.

Financial support to the tune of Rs. 8.121 million was extended to 671 students of the University by the District Zakat Committees, Political Agents, Higher Education Commission and University of Peshawar.

In the year 2005-06 the University held three convocations, one for the postgraduate departments, one for Islamia College and one for College of Home Economics wherein H. E. Mr. Khalil-ur-Rehman, the then honorable Chancellor / Governor N-W.F.P. presided over the events and awarded students with degrees and medals. Several meetings of the statutory bodies were held to

perform their respective functions and to ensure their contribution in smooth running of the University.

Directorate of Sports remained actively engaged in Sports activities. The University teams not only took part at various local and national games but the Directorate of Sports in collaboration with HEC organized several sports events on local, provincial and national level wherein numerous distinctions were achieved by the University.

Student societies are the principle vehicles through which the various activities on the campus are triggered, give vent to the students feeling and enhance the vision of the youth in nation building process. All the ten societies in year round activities pursued their assigned objectives.

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1 INTRODUCTION

The University of Peshawar founded in 1950, is the fulfillment of dream, which had long remained unrealized. The first seeds of the University may be said to have been sown by Sir Sahibzada Abdul Qayyum Khan, who boldly conceived the idea and founded Islamia College – the Dar-ul-ulum Islamia in 1913 at the first out-post of civilization, almost at the mouth of the historic Khyber Pass. The founder of Pakistan, Quaid-e-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah, who perhaps saw the strategic role of Peshawar in his mind, on April the 12th, 1948, while addressing the students and teachers of the Islamia Collage Peshawar, made the following memorable statements:

“You have referred to the question of Khyber University. Let me tell you that nothing is dearer to my heart than to have University in the North-West Frontier Province from where rays of learning and culture will spread throughout Central Asia; and provided you go the right way about it, you will get your University sooner than you can imagine”.

Two years after this memorable declaration of Quaid-e-Azam, a namesake of Sir Sahibzada Abdul Qayyum Khan and the first Chief Minister of NWFP Khan Abdul Qayyum Khan facilitated the establishment of University of Peshawar, Hence the promise of the Father of the nation was fulfilled, On 30th October 1950, Shaheed-e-Millat, Khan Liaqat Ali Khan, the first Prime Minister of Pakistan, laid the foundation stone of this University with these words:

“It is with very great pleasure that I have come here today to perform the inauguration of the University of Peshawar. This is a historic day for the people of this province and for Islamia College which has been the center of learning for such a long time and which has played an important part in the creation of the University. The Government and the people of the province can

take legitimate pride in their achievement as the inauguration of the University of Peshawar is an important landmark on the road to progress which the province is traversing so rapidly and yet so surely”.

The University of Peshawar, which started in a borrowed building of the Govt. Training School Peshawar (now Agriculture Training Institute) in 1950, has now developed into a first rate institution of the country as desired by its founder. During the course of the last fifty years, the University has grown into an educational township. The University has lately given birth to two other Universities and one medical college, which are working at the same campus. The campus is spread over 1050 acres of land. It is situated at a height of 1,138 ft, above sea level and is at a distance of about 6 km, westwards from Peshawar Cantonment on the way to Khyber Pass.

University of Peshawar is a teaching, and research institution, with a number of affiliated colleges of the province. It caters for undergraduate, postgraduate and professional level teaching and research programmes. It is a residential University, where more than half of the teaching staff, other employees, and students live on the campus. The University provides itself on its abundant lush green lawns, numerous flower – laden gardens watered by the canal coming from Bara and Kabul rivers and conglomeration of buildings both of medieval and modern types, overshadowed by a purple range of western mountains, with Tatarra the highest peak. It is a unique Institution in Pakistan and perhaps in the world, that imparts education from the nursery level to the highest Ph.D. degree level. The campus has its own shopping centers which include book shops, utility stores, grocery stores, medical stores, tailors, hair cutters, shoes shops, cafeterias, banks, etc.

The University of Peshawar started its function in 1950 with five teaching departments and a total enrollment of 129 students, only one of whom was a girl. At present the University has six faculties consisting of 40 postgraduate

departments, a Pashto Language Academy, two degree colleges, three schools, and six Centers. The overall enrollment of the university is now 104,479. In term of staff the University started with 15 teaching faculty and 27 non teaching staff in 1950. At present the University has 592 teaching staff, 2,159 non-teaching staff and 279 school teachers.

University of Peshawar has summer campus at Bara Gali which was handed over to the University of Peshawar in August 1965. Since then it is used as Summer Campus of the University. It is a hub of academic activities particularly conferences, seminars, workshops and symposiums in summer season. For a few years it had also been the center of the Staff Training Institute of the University of Peshawar.

2 ENROLLMENT

2.1 OVERALL ENROLLMENT

The University of Peshawar caters to a variety of students. It provides education from undergraduate to Ph.D. level. It also provides opportunity to private students. The overall enrollment of the university during the years is summarized as under:

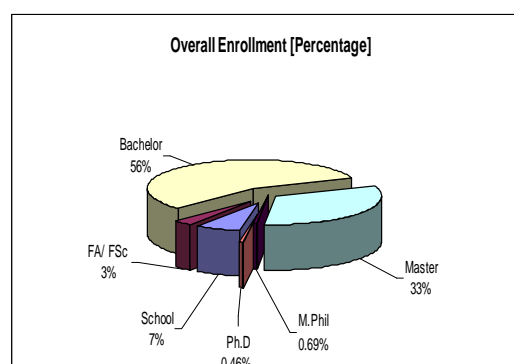
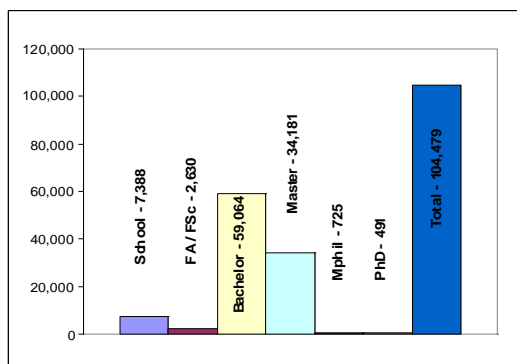


Figure 1-2: Overall Enrollment [Percentage]

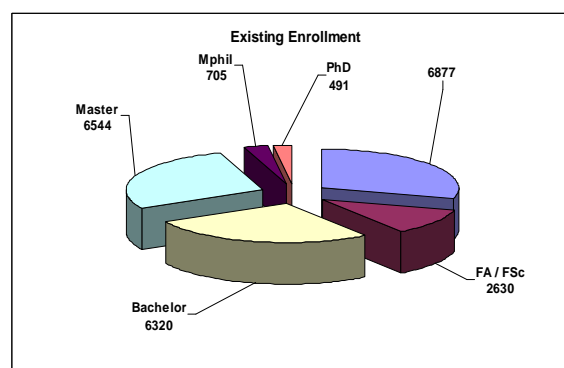
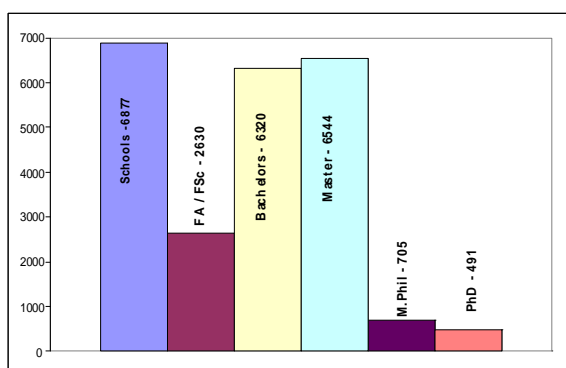


Figure 3-4: Existing Enrollment

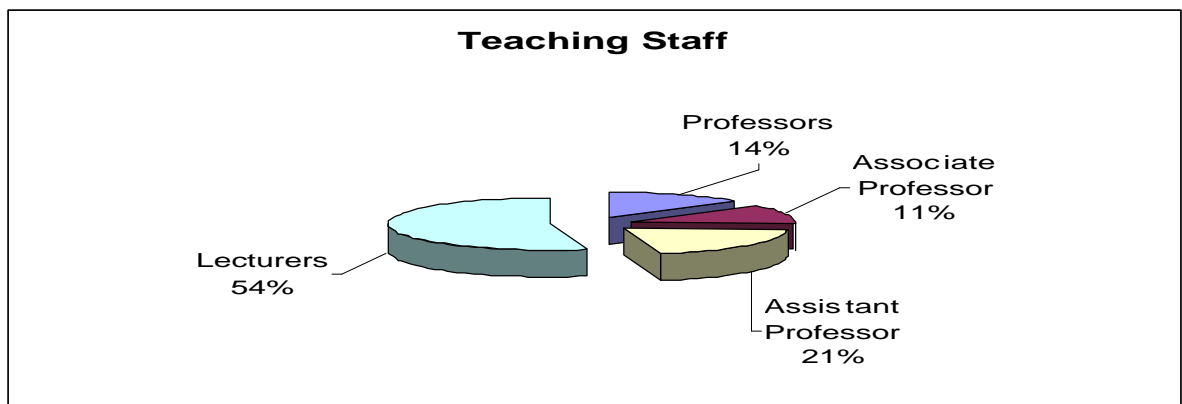


Figure 5A: Faculty-wise Teaching Staff

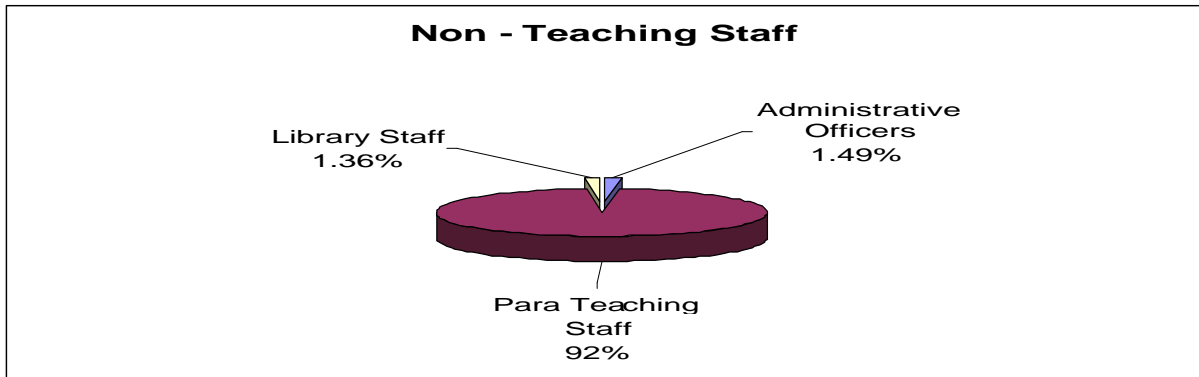


Figure 5B: Non - Teaching Staff

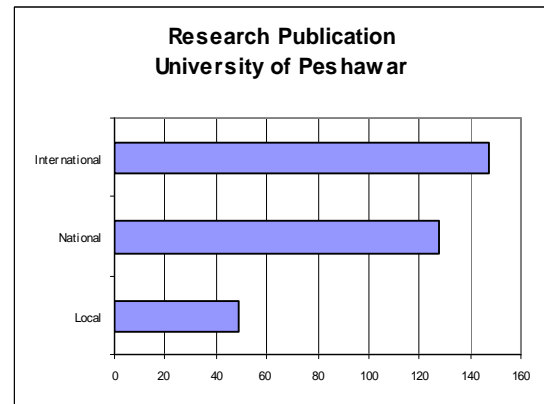
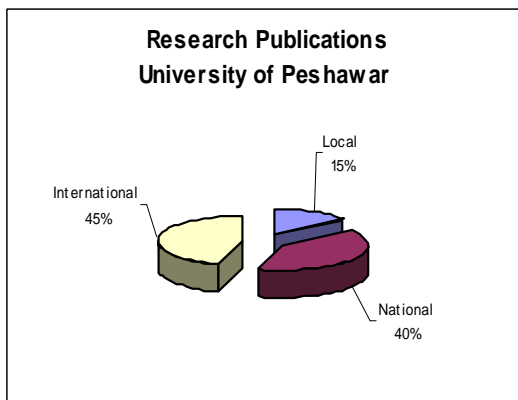


Figure 6-7A: Research Publications – University of Peshawar

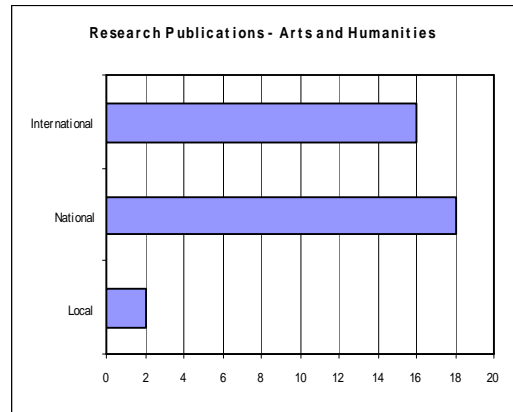
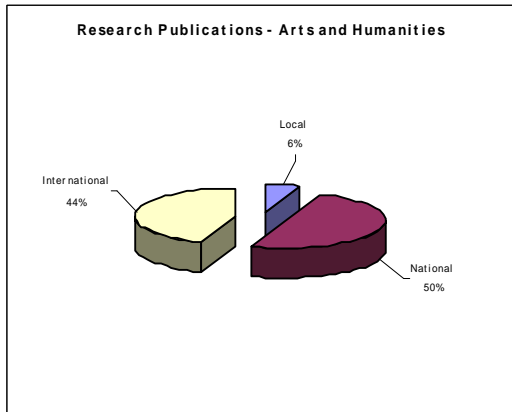


Figure 6-7B: Research Publications – Arts and Humanities

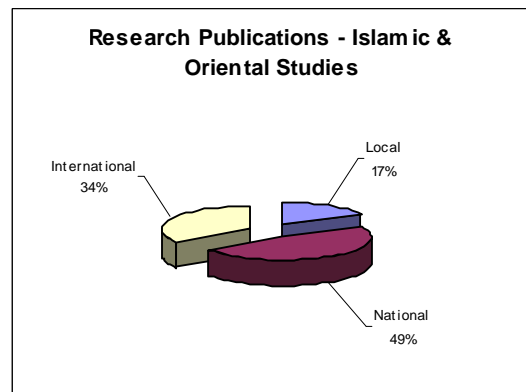
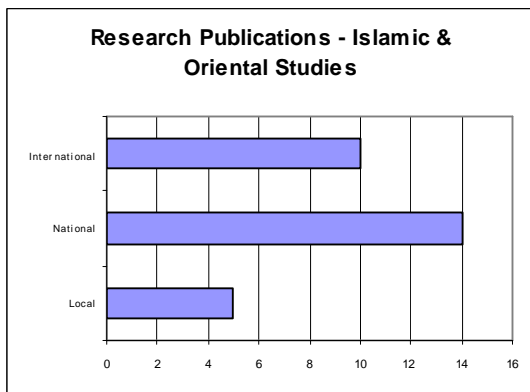


Figure 8-9: Research Publications – Islamic and Oriental Studies

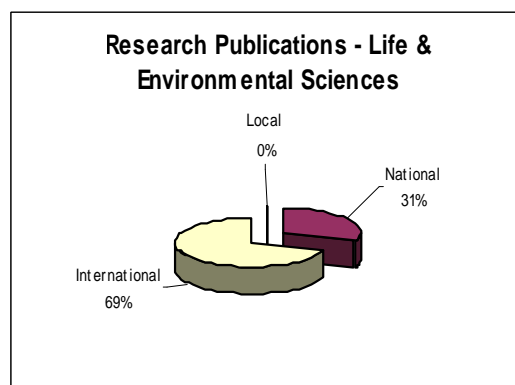
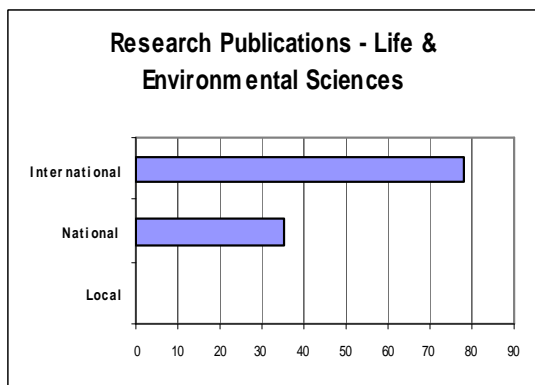


Figure 10-11: Research Publications – Life and Environmental Sciences

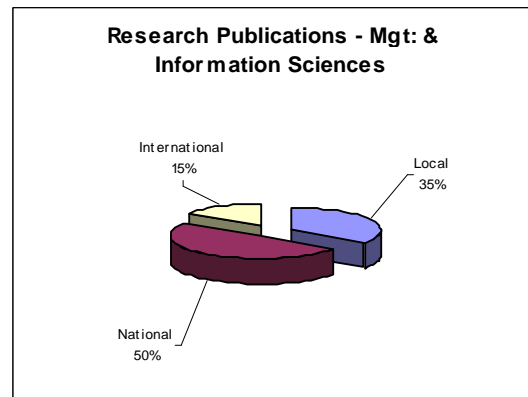
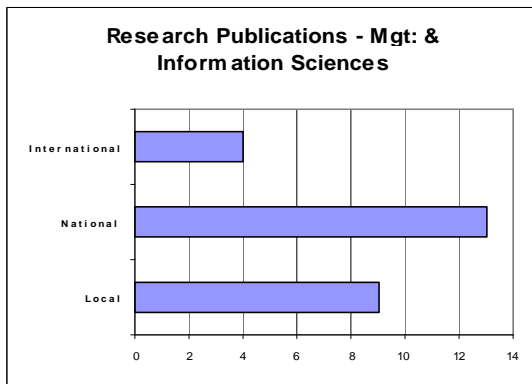


Figure 12-13: Research Publications – Mgt: and Information Sciences

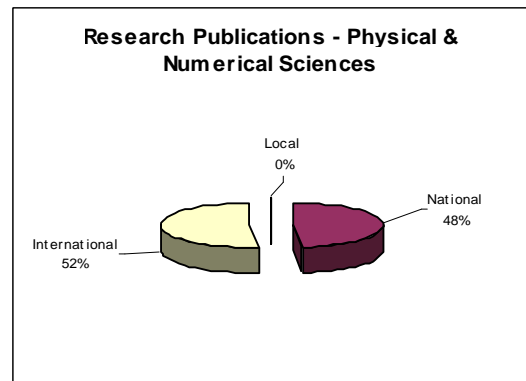
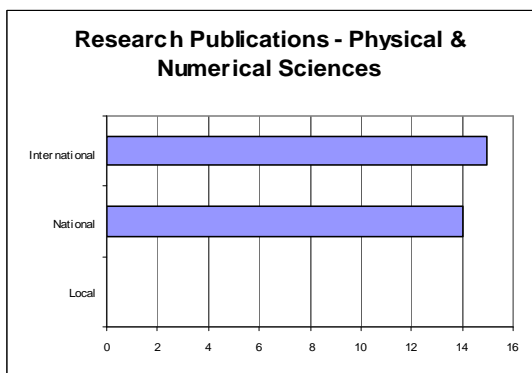


Figure 14-15: Research Publications – Physical and Numerical Sciences

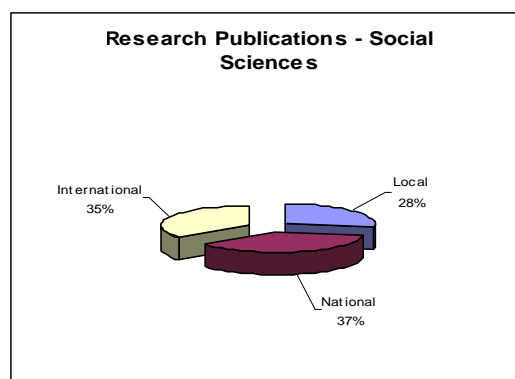
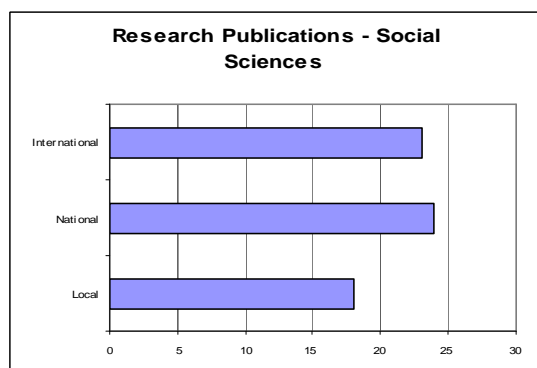


Figure 16-17: Research Publications – Social Sciences

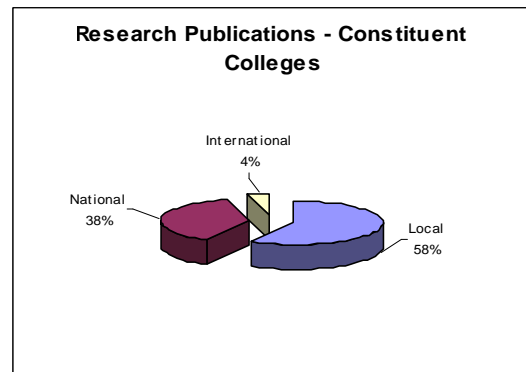
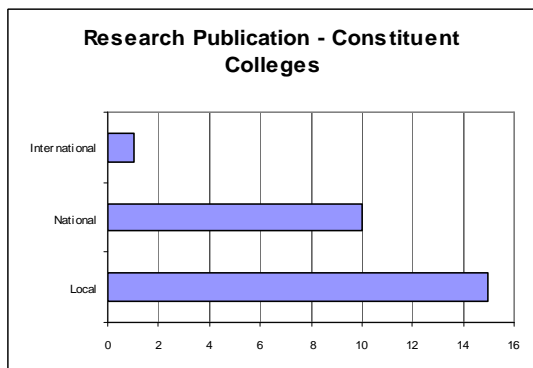


Figure 18-19: Research Publications – Constituent Colleges

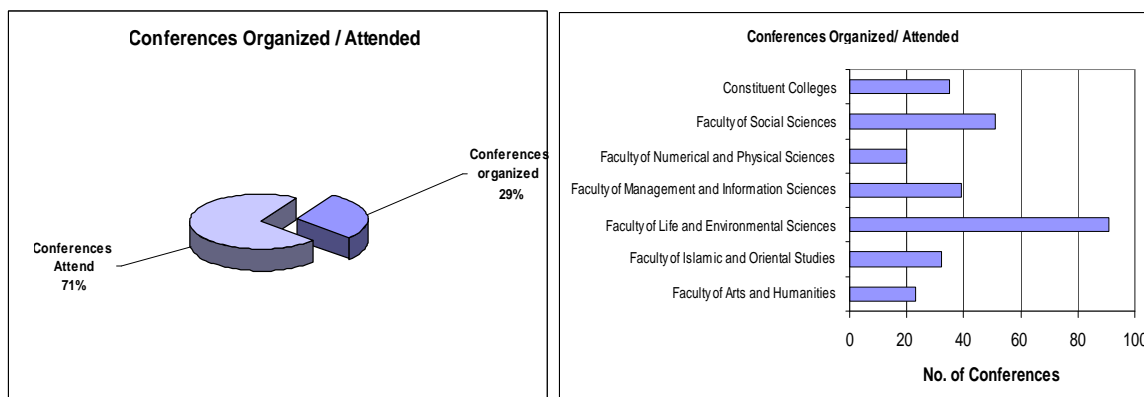


Figure 20 – 21 A: Activity Chart - Overall

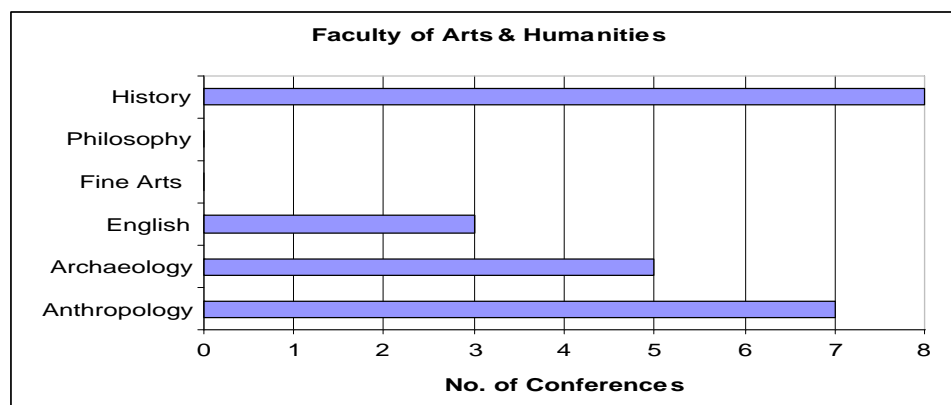
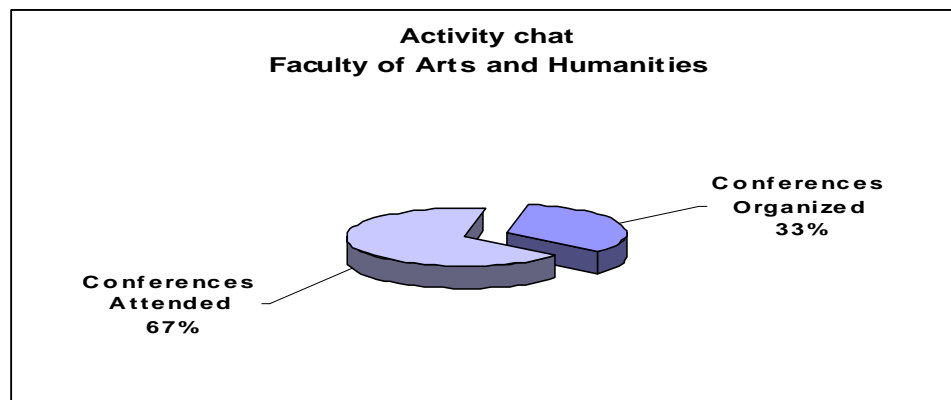


Figure 22 -23 B: Activity Chart Faculty of Arts and Humanities

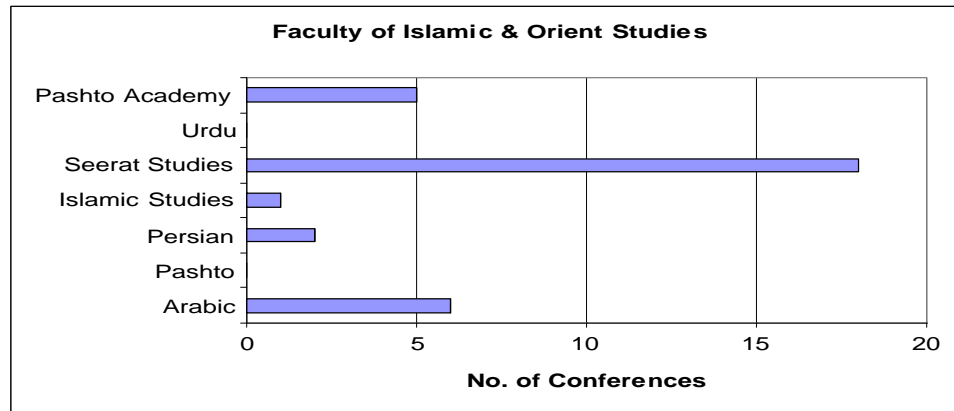
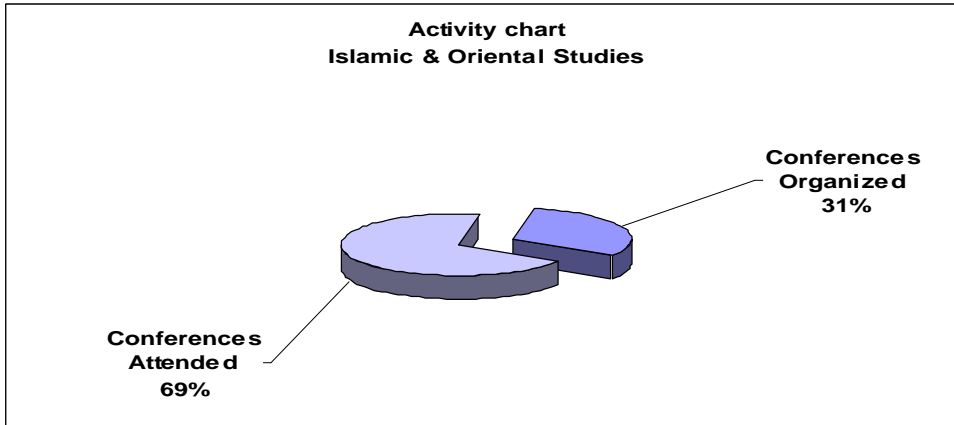


Figure 24 - 25: Activity Chart Faculty of Islamic and Oriental Studies

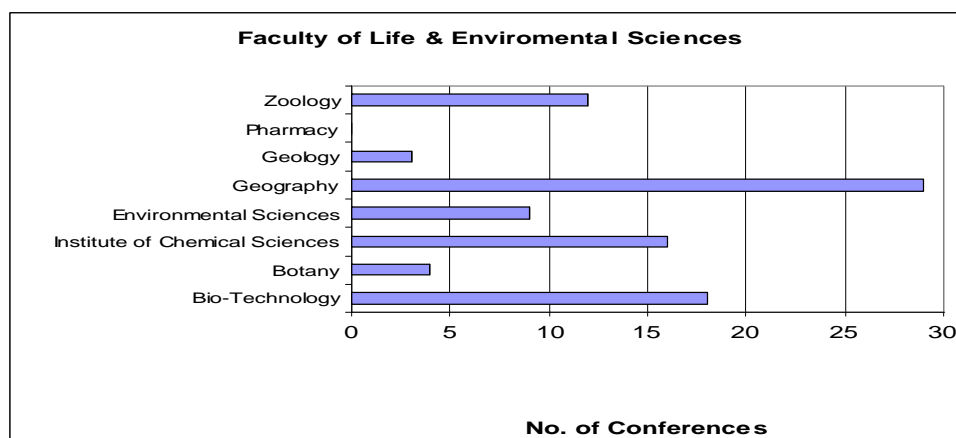
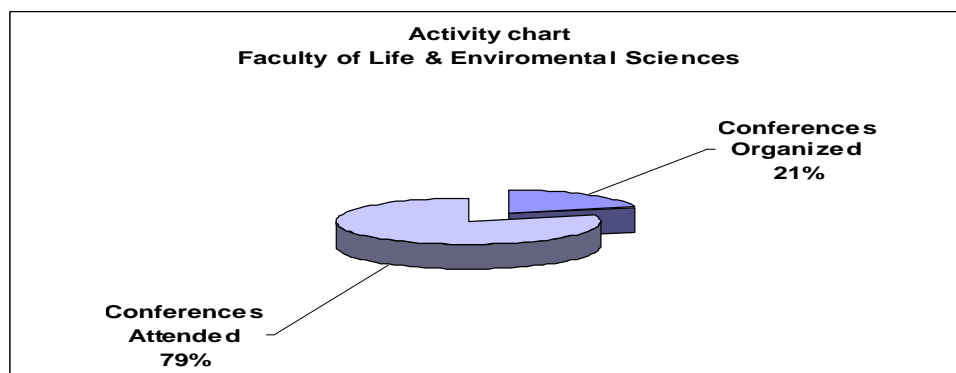


Figure 26-27: Activity Chart Faculty of Life and Environmental Studies

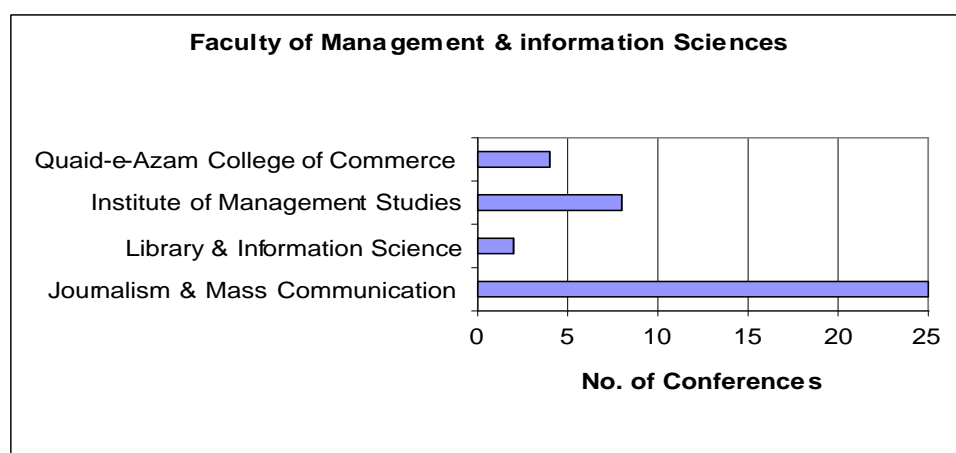
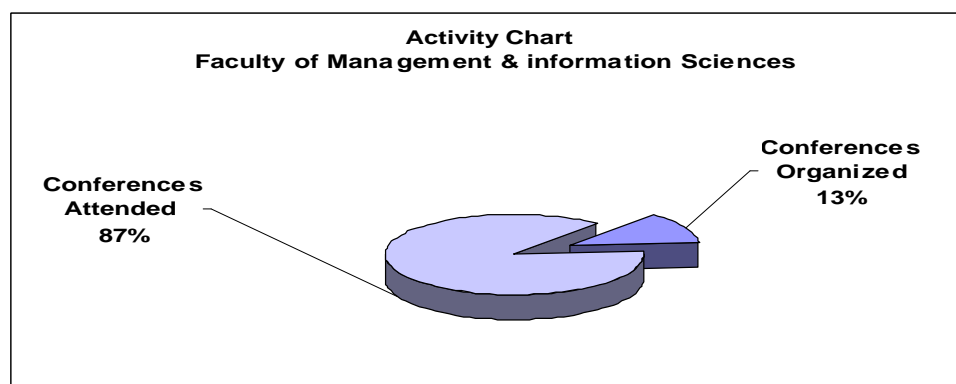


Figure 28 - 29: Activity Chart Faculty of Management and Information Sciences

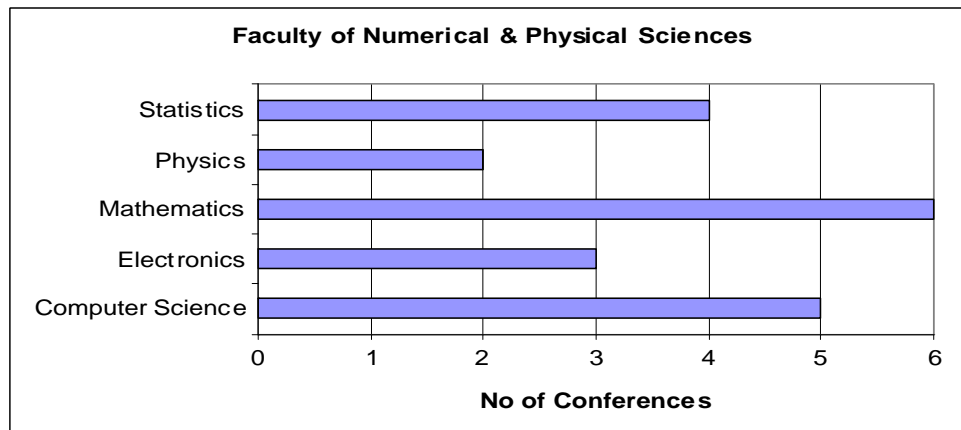
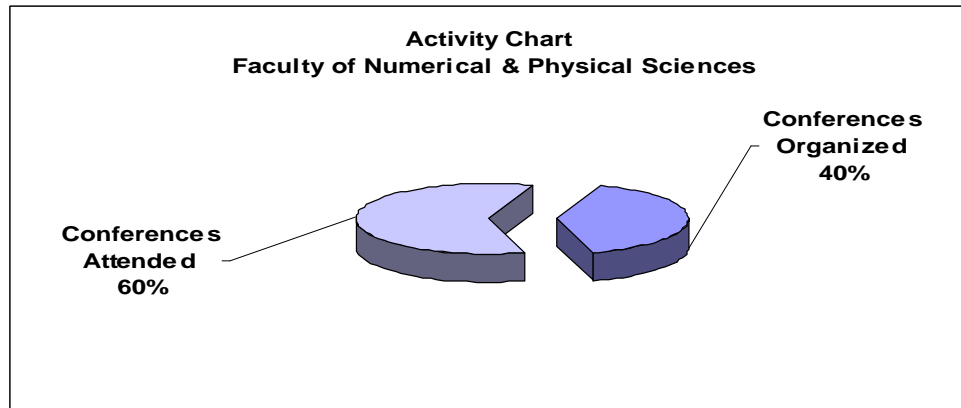


Figure 30 - 31: Activity Chart Faculty of Numerical and Physical Sciences

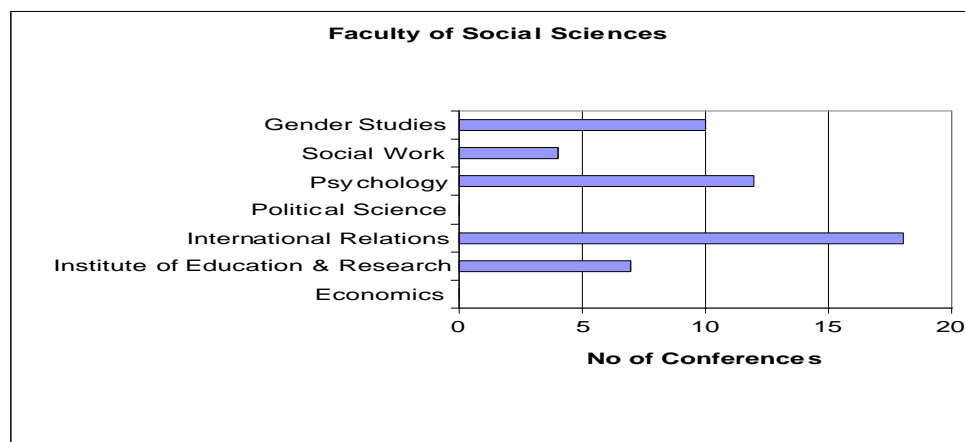
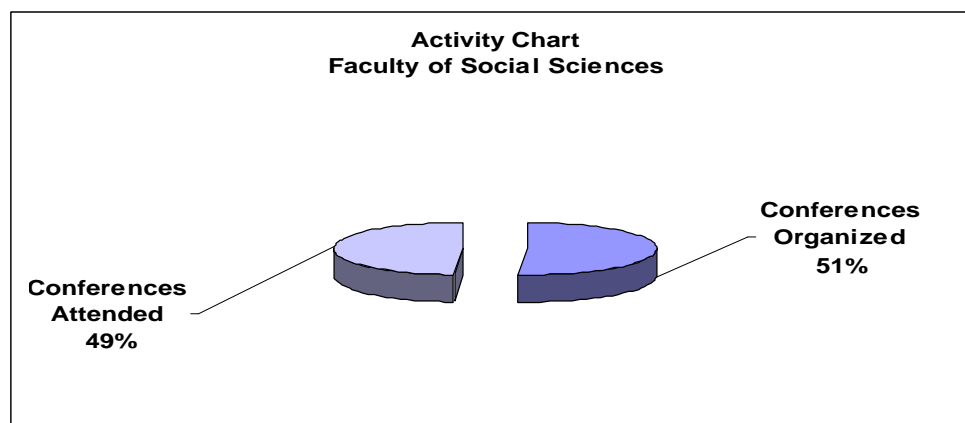


Figure 32 - 33: Activity Chart Faculty of Social Sciences

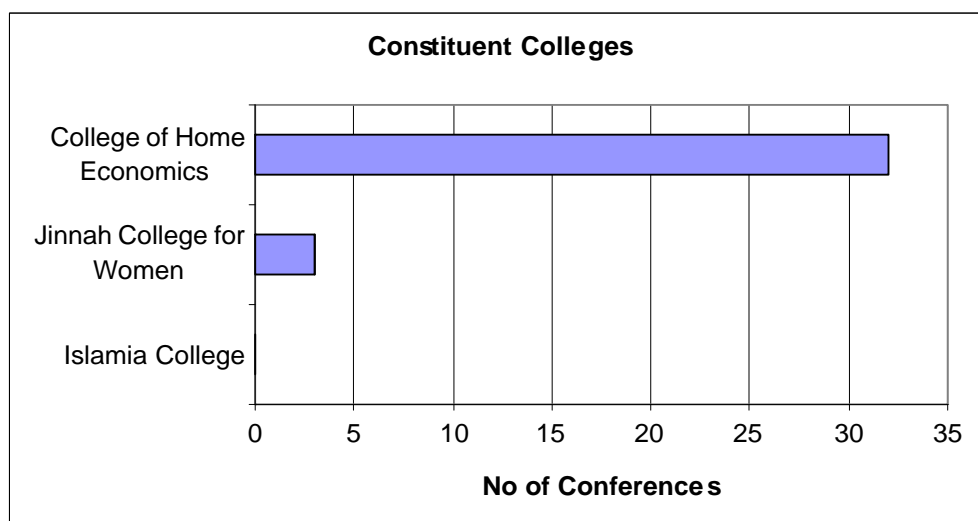
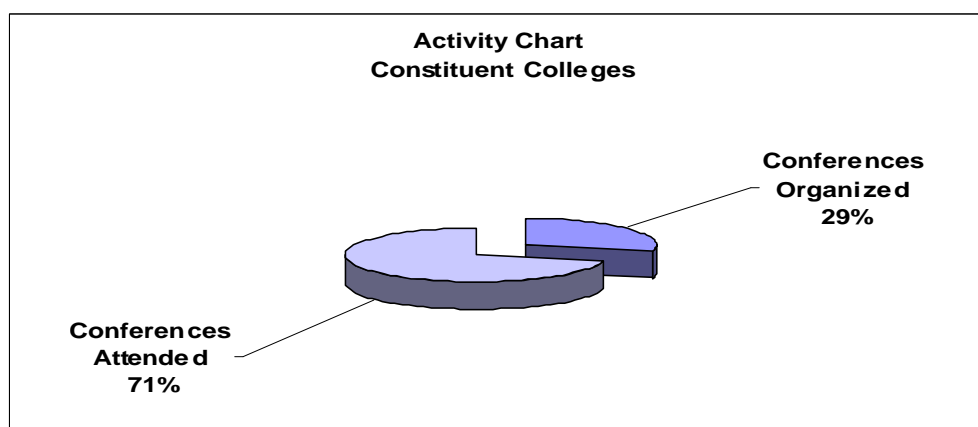


Figure 34-35: Activity Chart Constituent Colleges

University of Peshawar has been actively involved in strengthening academic and research linkages as well as creating new ones with universities both national and international.

During the year under discussion, University of Peshawar has developed new linkages with the following international organizations / institutes of repute.

9.1 UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS, AMHERST, USA

The University of Peshawar and the University of Massachusetts, Amherst at Massachusetts, USA has shown their interest to join hands in the following inter-institutional memorandum on academic and research collaboration linkage.

The University of Peshawar and University of Massachusetts, Amherst have agreed to cooperate in joint educational programs and research projects, especially, in the fields of Computer Science, Information Technology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Biological Sciences, Economics, Management Studies and Linguistics as well as other areas of mutual interest. Under this Memorandum, both the universities will encourage direct contacts and

cooperation between their faculty members, departments, institutes and academic planning staff. As per interest shown, both universities have agreed to:

2. Establishing mutually beneficial collaborative research projects between departments and individual faculty members.
3. Training of the University of Peshawar doctoral research students and faculty members at pre-doctoral and post-doctoral levels respectively.
4. Exchange of faculty members for short- and long-term visits for the purpose of research, teaching courses and presentation of seminars.
5. Joint supervision of doctoral research students between the interested faculty members on both sides.
6. Assistance in the provision of research equipments/instruments, research literature and library resource materials.
7. Short-term exchange visits of the academic planning and academic quality improvement/assessment staff.
8. Holding of joint workshops and symposia.
9. Other activities of mutual interest/benefit.

A PC-1 of US\$ 257,700 was also submitted to the Higher Education Commission for funding the activities planned to achieve the aims of the agreement. The case is in process.

9.2 UTAH STATE UNIVERSITY, LOGAN, USA

Utah State University at Logan, Utah, USA and the University of Peshawar, Peshawar, Pakistan, agreed upon academic exchange and cooperation in teaching and research in the furtherance of the advancement and dissemination of knowledge, agree to the following:

- a. To encourage and use their best endeavors to effect, visits from one university to the other by members of the academic staff for the

purpose of participating in joint teaching, Joint Research, Joint Conferences and Joint cultural programmes.

- b. To offer admission from one university to the other to qualified students to enroll in undergraduate and graduate courses.
- c. To encourage the exchange of scientific materials, publications and information.
- d. To prepare, as necessary, a working programme detailing specific forms and contents of cooperation.

The collaboration is comprehensive in nature and covers all academic programmes in both universities.

A PC-1 of US\$ 257,700 was prepared and submitted for funding by the Higher Education Commission.

9.3 UNIVERSITY OF EXETER, UK

The Institute of Arab and Islamic Studies of the University of Exeter, UK and the Faculty of Islamic and Oriental Studies of the University of Peshawar, Pakistan, desiring to develop academic exchange and cooperation in teaching and research in the furtherance of the advancement and dissemination of knowledge, agree to the following:-

- a. To encourage and use their best endeavors to effect visits from one university to the other by academic staff for the purpose of participating in joint teaching, joint research, joint conferences and joint cultural programmes in the fields of Islamic Studies and Oriental Languages.
- b. To offer admission from one university to the other to qualified students to enroll in undergraduate and postgraduate courses.
- c. To encourage the exchange of scientific materials, publications and information.

To prepare, as necessary, a working programme detailing specific forms and contents of cooperation.

9.4 HIROSHIMA UNIVERSITY, JAPAN

Faculty of Life and Environmental Sciences and Faculty of Numerical and Physical Sciences, university of Peshawar established an academic and educational exchange agreement with the Graduate School of Science, Hiroshima University, Japan. The agreement envisages promotion of mutual understanding between the two countries and between the two faculties through educational and academic collaboration and exchange, and to contribute to the advancement and progress of learning. Both faculties agreed to promote the following exchange programmes.

- a. Promotion of joint research
- b. Exchange of faculty members and administrative staff.
- c. Exchange of students
- d. Exchange of research outcomes, academic publications and other academic information
- e. Other academic and educational exchange programmes approved on mutual agreement on both sides.

9.5 CONSULATE GENERAL OF ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN, PESHAWAR

The MOU already signed on June 06, 2003 between the Consulate General of Islamic Republic of Iran, Peshawar and the University of Peshawar for the establishment of a Center for study and Research of Persian and Related Languages of NWFP was re-activated in 2005. A steering committee was constituted comprising of representatives from both sides to take the necessary steps for realization of the objectives of the MOU. Subsequent meetings of the steering committee have led to formulation of an action plan. The execution of the action plan is underway.

9.6 CAMPUS CONSULTANCY SERVICES LTD. U.K. (CCS)

A MoU was signed between University of Peshawar and Campus Consultancy Services Ltd. U.K. on February 23, 2006 with the objective of providing consultancy to University of Peshawar for services of placement of students in highly ranked universities accredited by the U.K Government, such as York, Liverpool, Strathclyde, Glasgow, Southampton, Loughborough, Surrey, Leicester, Hull, Essex, Brunel etc. Obtain, in principle, offer of a place in chosen subject areas prior to submission of a formal application.

10 RESEARCH PROJECTS AND OTHER GRANTS

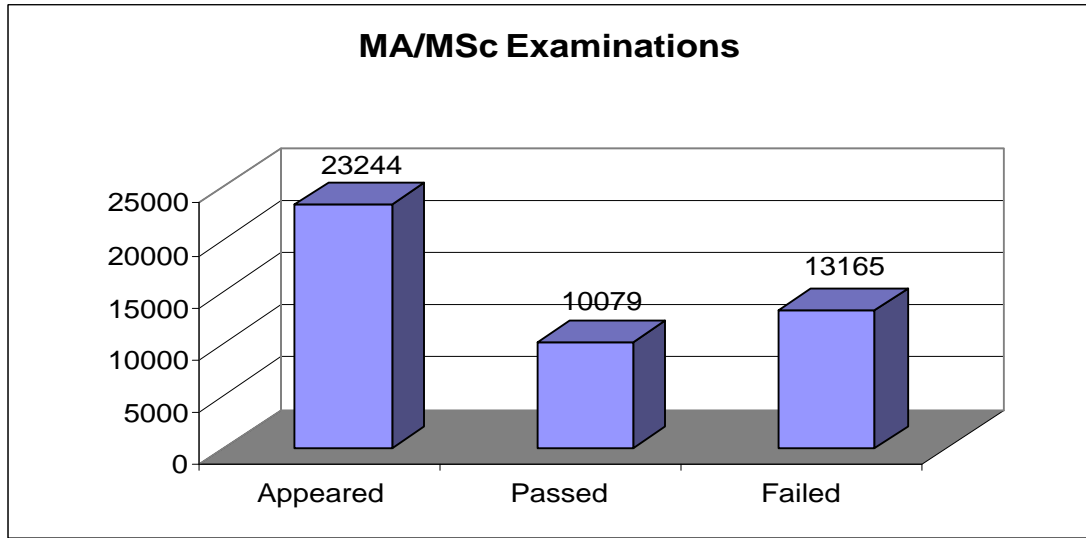


Figure 36: M.A./ M.Sc. Aggregate Results

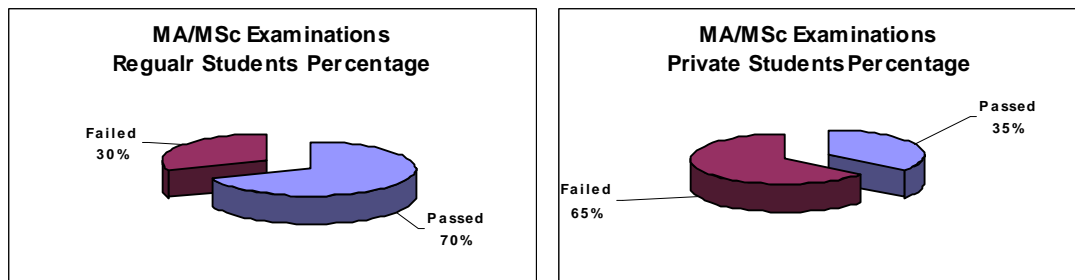


Figure 37 -38: M.A./ M.Sc. Pass – Fail Percentages [Regular And Private Students]

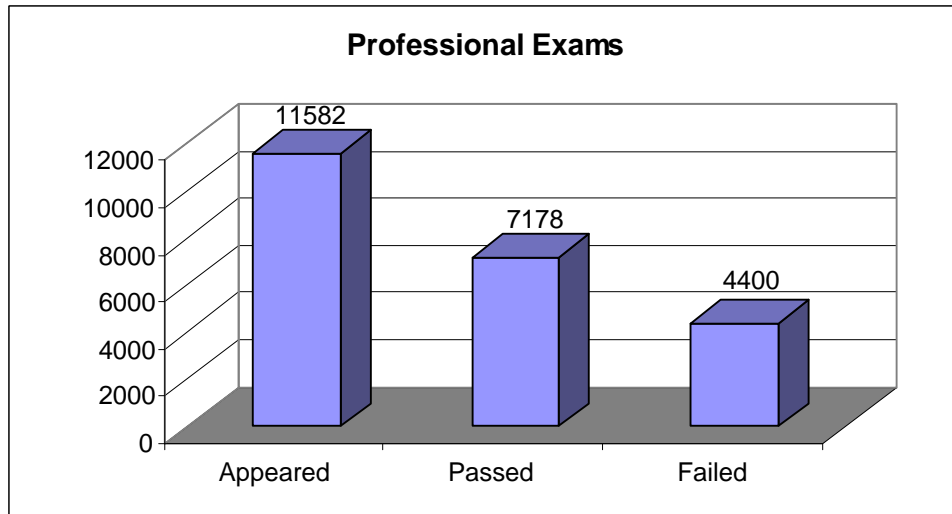


Figure 39 A: Professional Examinations - Aggregate Results

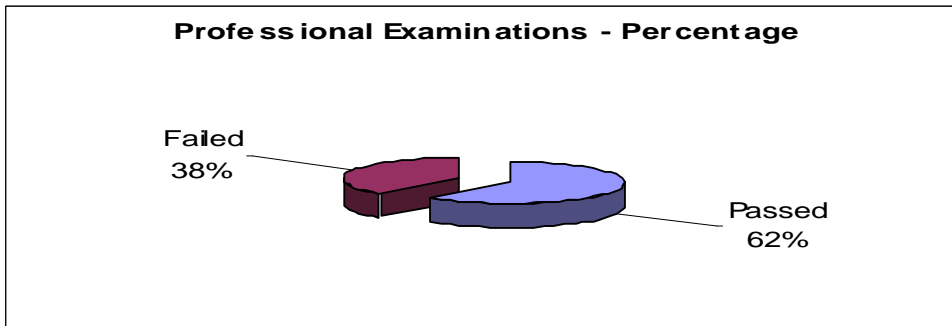


Figure 39 B: Pass – Fail Percentages in Professional Examinations

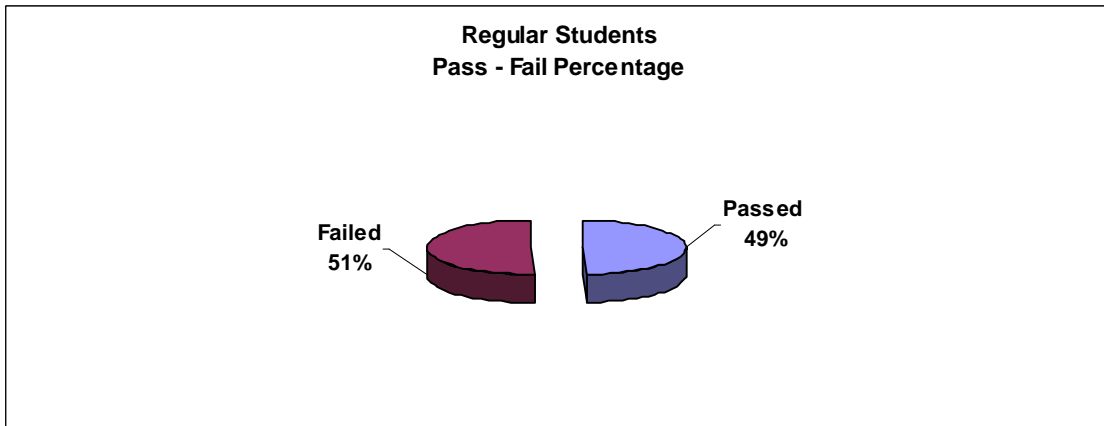
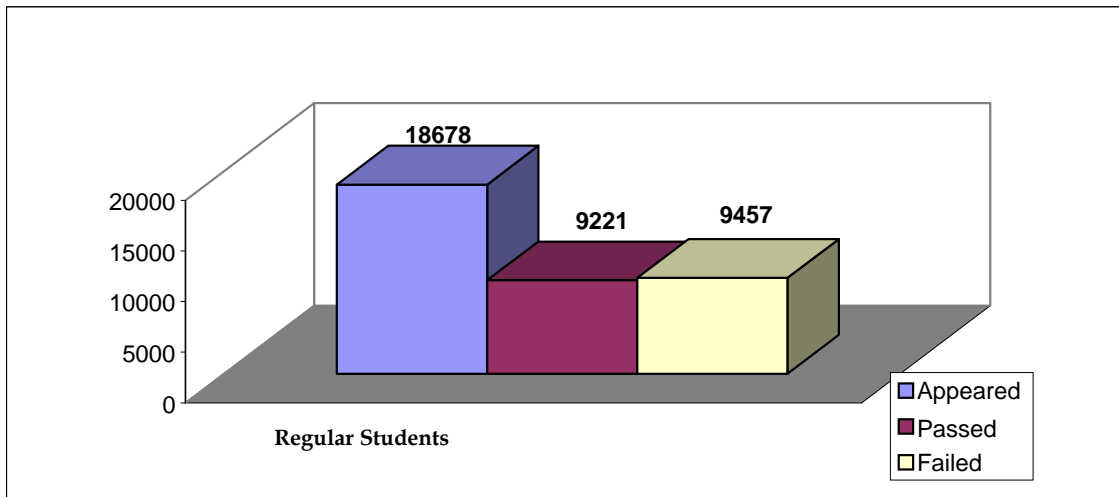


Figure 40 - 41: BA/BSc Regular Students Pass – Fail Percentage

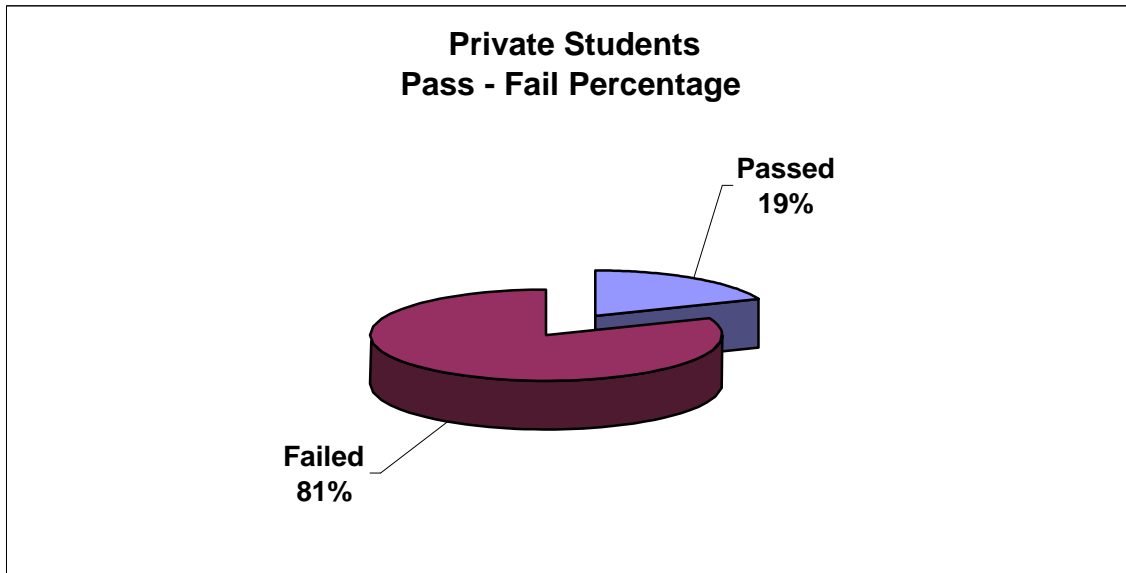
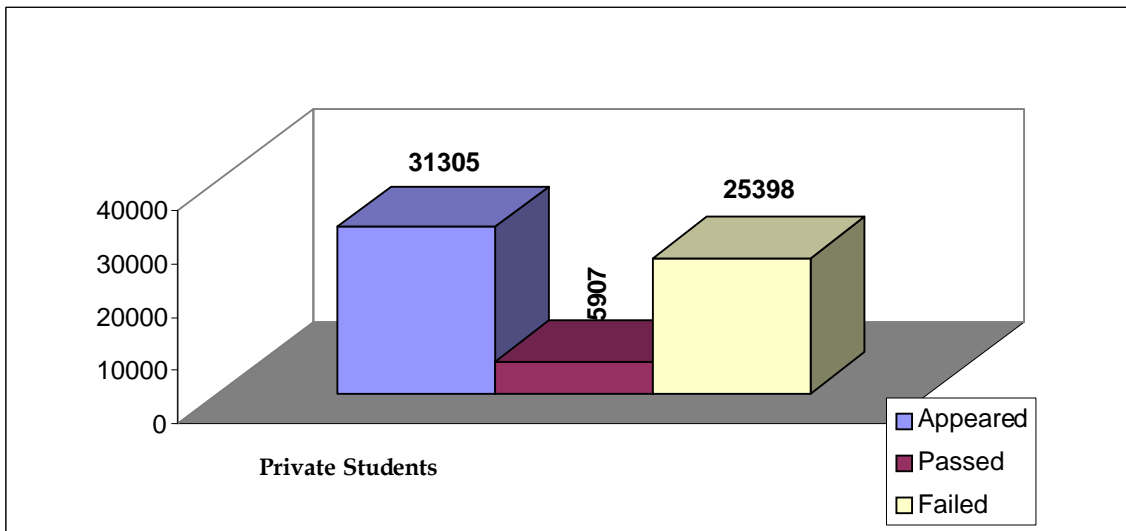


Figure 42 - 43: BA/BSc Private Students Pass – Fail Percentage

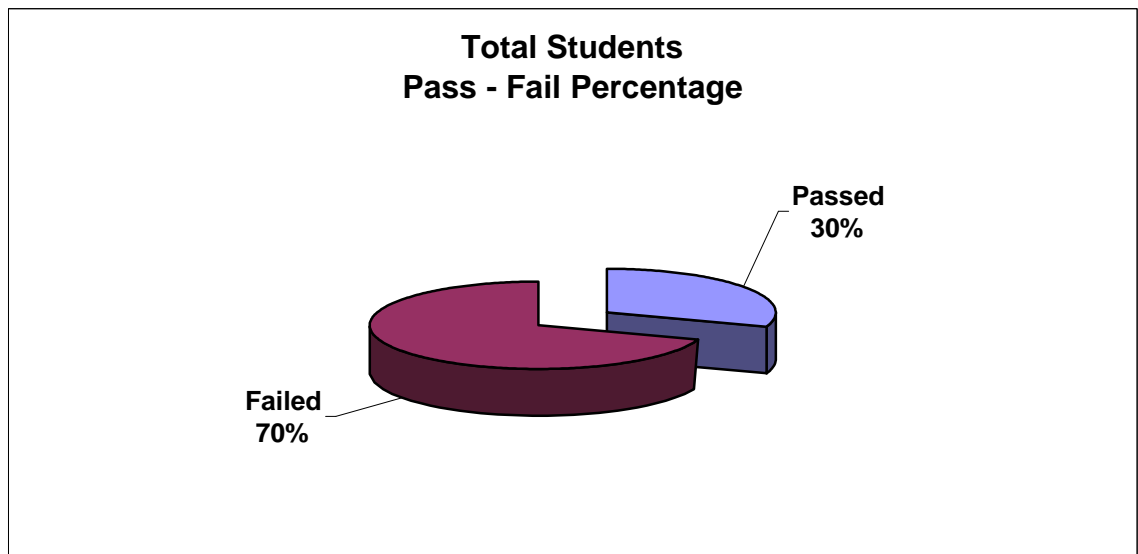
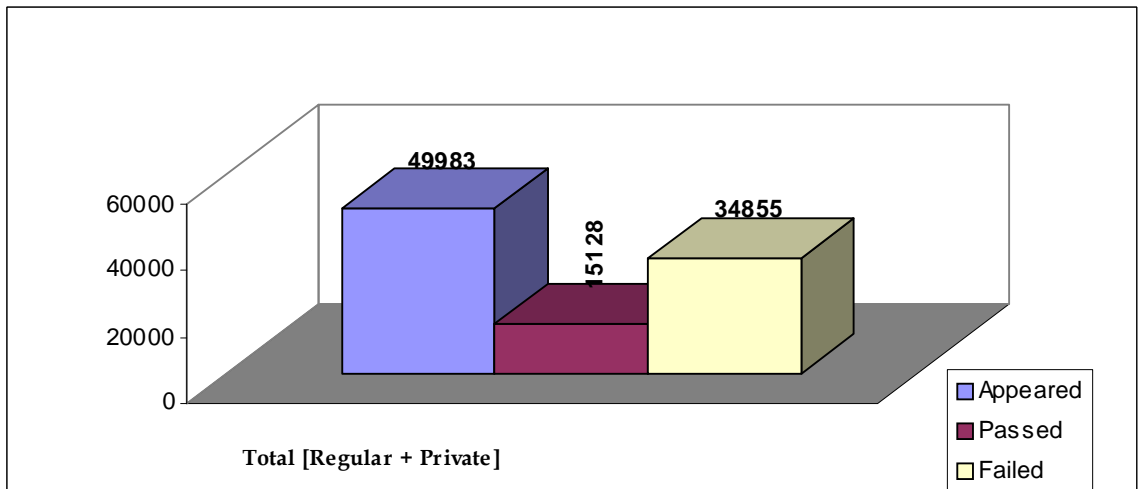


Figure 44- 45: BA/BSc Total Students Pass Fail Percentages

12 DEVELOPMENTAL PROJECTS

4. The Digital Library Programme, which provides access to high-quality peer-reviewed international scientific informations (academic journals and scholarly publications) via online delivery.

13 QUALITY ENHANCEMENT

Quality Enhancement Cell of the University of Peshawar is actively pursuing the aims, objectives and programmes initiated by Higher Education Commission also mentioned in the Medium Term Development Framework 2005-2010, for over all improvement of Quality of education at the university both academically and administratively.

1. The Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) initiated the self-assessment process in June 2005 of programmes and courses in the Departments and Centers of the University of Peshawar through the Steering Committee comprising of Deans of Faculties. As a requirement of self-assessment procedures, the departments constituted Self Assessment Teams.
2. Workshop on “Self Assessment of Academic Programmes”, arranged by HEC, was attended by the Director QEC and Muhammad Jahanzeb Khan from Psychology Department from 10th to 11th May, 2006.
3. “Programme Completion Survey” and “Course Evaluation” surveys were conducted through a set of standardized proforma in the departments. The feedback obtained was statistically represented, analyzed and the finding will soon be communicated to the concerned for improvement purposes.
4. Two-Day Training Workshop for the University of Peshawar Teachers on Self Assessment Model of HEC at Bara-Galli Summer Campus on June 19 and 20, 2006.
5. A lecture on Filling Patents was arranged by QEC on February 24, 2006 at the Vice Chancellors Secretariat, University of Peshawar. The Speaker was Dr. Sarfaraz Khan Niazi from Chicago USA
6. A presentation on British Alumni (NWFP) was arranged at Sahibzada Abdul Qayyum Hall, University of Peshawar on March 9, 2006 by persons

who pursued higher studies at institutions of higher education in UK to present their views regarding various course/programmes and a wide range of other activities such as seminars etc.

7. Approval of the proposal of QEC by the Vice Chancellor regarding compulsory thesis writing at Masters level in departments which have not yet initiated this option.
8. Approval of QEC proposal for incentives in terms of remuneration to the supervisors of masters theses as well as enhancement of existing honorarium to the M.Phil and PhD supervisors, giving financial support for publishing articles in national and international journals.
9. The QEC prepared a code of conduct for teaching and research, duly approved by the Vice Chancellor, was circulated to the faculty for adherence.
10. Hiring of Foreign Faculty Processing: The following foreign professors were engaged in various disciplines in the University of Peshawar under the HEC, Foreign Faculty Hiring Programme.
 - The processing of these cases was done by QEC:
 1. Dr. Yaseen Iqbal for Department of Physics
 2. Professor Rafiullah Khan for the Department of Chemistry
 3. Dr. Nurul Kabir for the Department of Chemistry.
 4. Dr. Ghias uddin for the Department of Chemistry.
 - Besides, the cases of Dr. Mohammad Aslam Khan, an expatriate Pakistani based in Canada and Dr. Anisa under HEC Eminent Scientists Programme are being processed by QEC, University of Peshawar.

11. Future action plan:

- i. Programme and Course evaluation is a continuous process and will be continued in the next academic session as well.
- ii. “Programme Completion Survey” and “Course Evaluation Questionnaire”, Graduating Students Survey, and Faculty Survey Proforma have been circulated for feedback. It will be followed up and made sure that the feedback is submitted well in time for analysis.
- iii. The results of already received feedback will be circulated to the faculties for improving the quality of teaching and program.
- iv. Orientation programmes/Seminars/Workshops on themes related to Quality Assurance will be arranged.

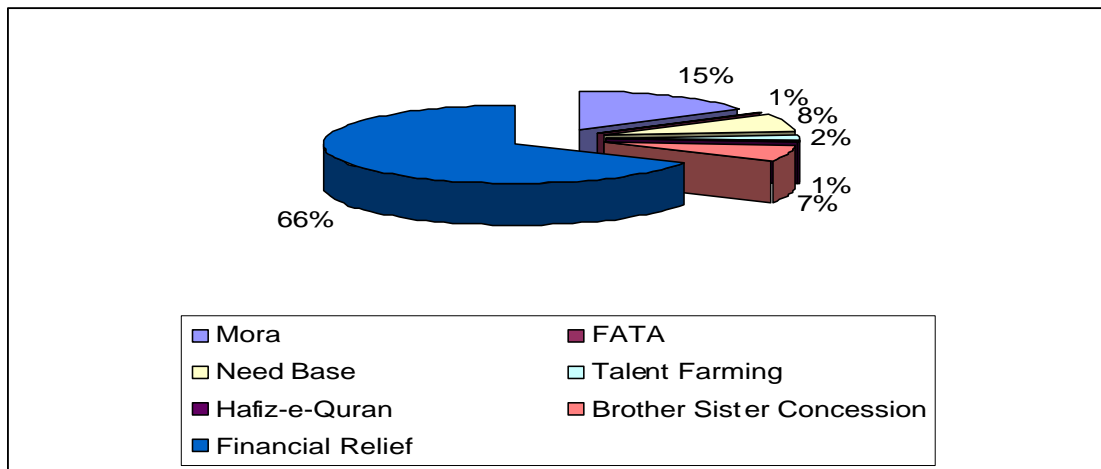


Figure 46: Percentage View of Scholarships Awarded to students

Recently one more society has been formed under the dynamic leadership of the Provost University of Peshawar Dr. M. Farooq Swati. The credit of organizing the pioneer society goes to Mr. Sher Bahadar Khan the Registrar of Peshawar University.

As far as the organizational structure is concerned, the Vice chancellor Peshawar University and Provost act as the Chief Patron and Patron of the societies. There is a network of teacher organizers under the chairmanship of a chief organizer. The student cabinet works under the guidance of the teacher organizers, which comprises of a President, Vice President, General Secretary, Joint Secretary, Media Secretary, Public Relation Officer, male and female. The calendar year of the student activities spans over a period of one year starting from September up to August.

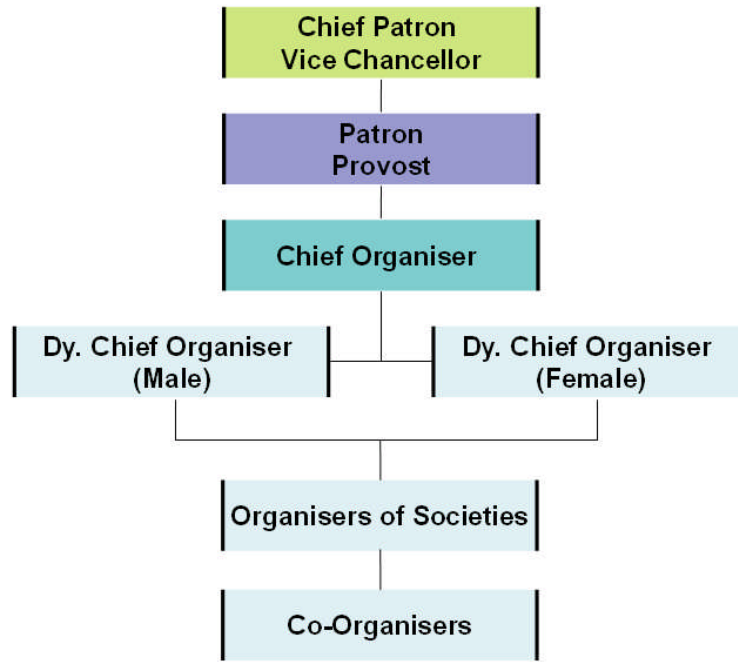
