Vision

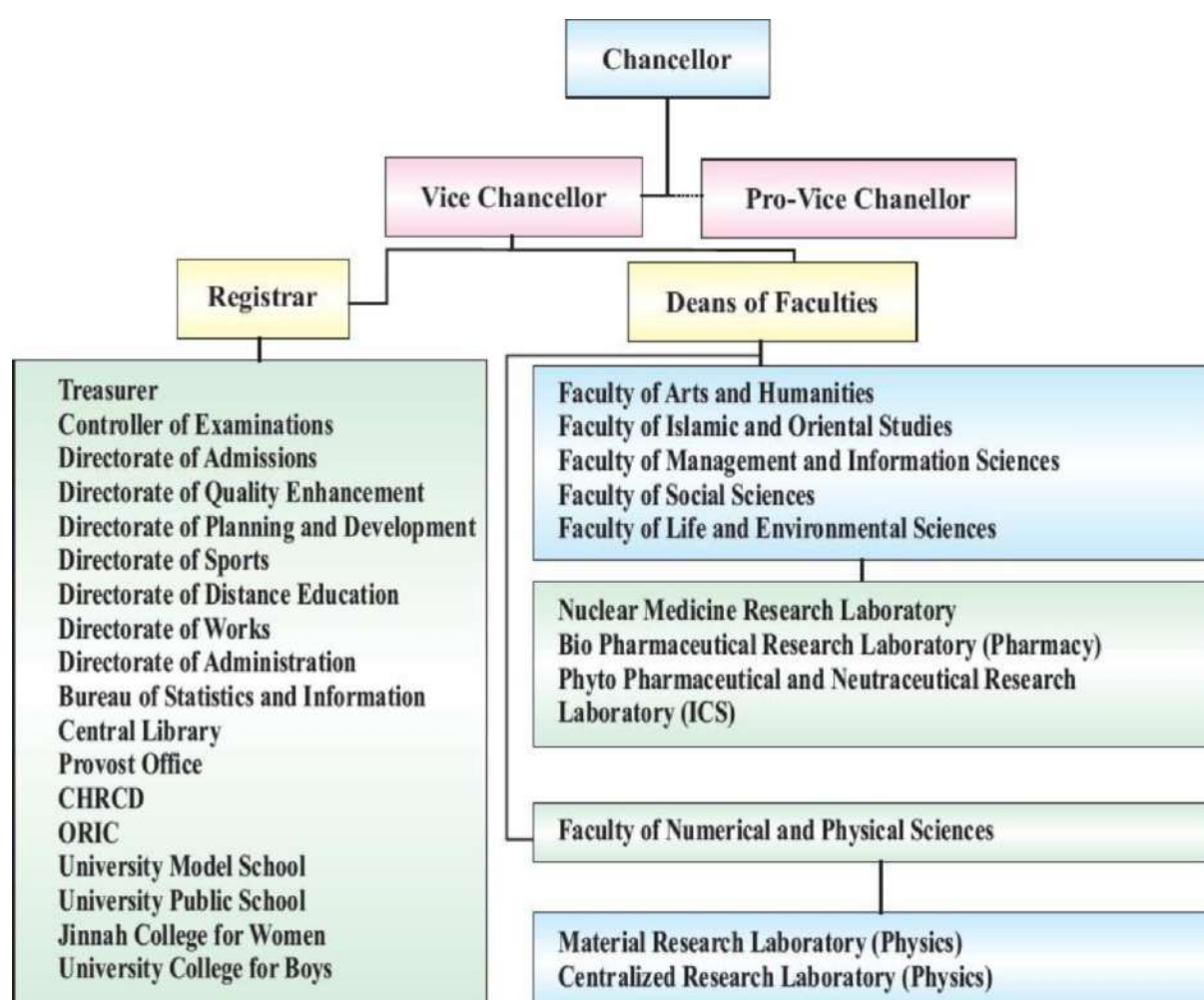

Historic Perspective

The University, founded in 1950, is the fulfilment of a dream, which had long remained unrealized. The first seed of the University may be said to have been sown by Sir Sahibzada Abdul Qayyum Khan, who conceived the idea and founded Islamia College - (The Dar-ul-ulum Islamia) in 1913. The founder of Pakistan, Quaid-e-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah, who perhaps visualized the strategic role of Peshawar, on 12th April, 1948, while addressing the students and teachers of Islamia College Peshawar, made the following memorable statement:

"You have referred to the question of Khyber University. Let me tell you that nothing is dearer to my heart than to have a University in the North-West Frontier Province from where rays of learning and culture will spread throughout Central Asia; and provided you go the right way about it, you will get your University sooner than you can imagine".

Two years later, the first Chief Minister of NWFP Khan Abdul Qayyum Khan facilitated the establishment of the University and hence the promise of the father of the nation was fulfilled. On 30th October 1950, Shaheed-e-Millat, Khan Liaqat Ali Khan, the first Prime Minister of Pakistan, laid the foundation stone of this University with these words:

"It is with very great pleasure that I have come here today to perform the inauguration of the University. This is a historic day for the people of this province and for Islamia College, which has been the centre of learning for such a long time and which, has played an important part in the creation of the University. The Government and the people of the province can take legitimate pride in their achievement as the inauguration of the University is an important landmark on the road to progress which the province is traversing so rapidly and yet so surely".

The University took a start in a borrowed building of Government Training School Peshawar (now Agricultural Training Institute) in 1950. It has now developed into a first-rate institution of the country as desired by its founder. In the last seventy two years / three full-fledged universities have branched out from it, and the University's own campus has grown into an educational city.

The University is a public sector teaching and research institution, with a number of affiliated colleges of the province. It caters for undergraduate, postgraduate and professional teaching and research programmes. It is a residential university, where more than half of the teaching staff, other employees, and students live on the campus.

The University campus is spread over an area of more than 1212 acres of land. It is situated at a height of 1,138 ft., above sea level and is at about 6 km, westwards from Peshawar Cantonment on the way to Khyber Pass. The University prides itself on its abundant verdant lawns, numerous flower-laden gardens watered by the canal coming from Bara and Kabul rivers, and conglomeration of buildings, both of traditional and modern architecture styles, overshadowed by a purple range of western mountains, with Tataras as the highest peak. It is a unique institution of Pakistan and perhaps in the world, that offers education from nursery to Ph.D. level. The campus has its own shopping centres, health care centres, and community centres.

The University has a summer campus at Bara Gali at an altitude of about 8000 ft. above sea level that spreads over an area of 67 acres. It was an abandoned cantonment of British period, which was handed over to the University in August 1965 by the then President General Muhammad Ayub Khan. Since then it is used as a Summer Campus of the University. In summers it is a hub of academic activities particularly conferences, seminars, workshops and symposia organized by various faculties and institutes. It has also been used by Centre for Human Resource and Career Development (CHRCDD) of the University for imparting various trainings.

The University acquired a land of 87 acres at Azakhel through a lease agreement with the district government Nowshera for the establishment of a Centre of Biodiversity/Botanical Garden. The Centre

was established with the financial assistance of HEC. It is one of the leading biodiversity centres of international standing.

The University is proud of having established the first Environmental Sciences Department, Centre for Disaster Preparedness and Management, and Directorate of Distance Education at the national level. Nuclear Medicine Research Lab (NMRL), Centralized Resource Lab (CRL), Phyto-Pharmaceutical and Neutraceutical Research Lab (PNRL), a sophisticated Material Resource Lab (MRL), Institute of Peace and Conflict Studies, Office of Research Innovation and Commercialization, Campus Management Solutions, Institute of Criminology and Forensic Sciences, Career Development Centre and China Study Centre are also established.

The University is catering to the academic needs of the people of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The University is recognized in political, industrial and government leadership all over the country. The University has an over-whelming contribution in achieving positive changes in the Society.

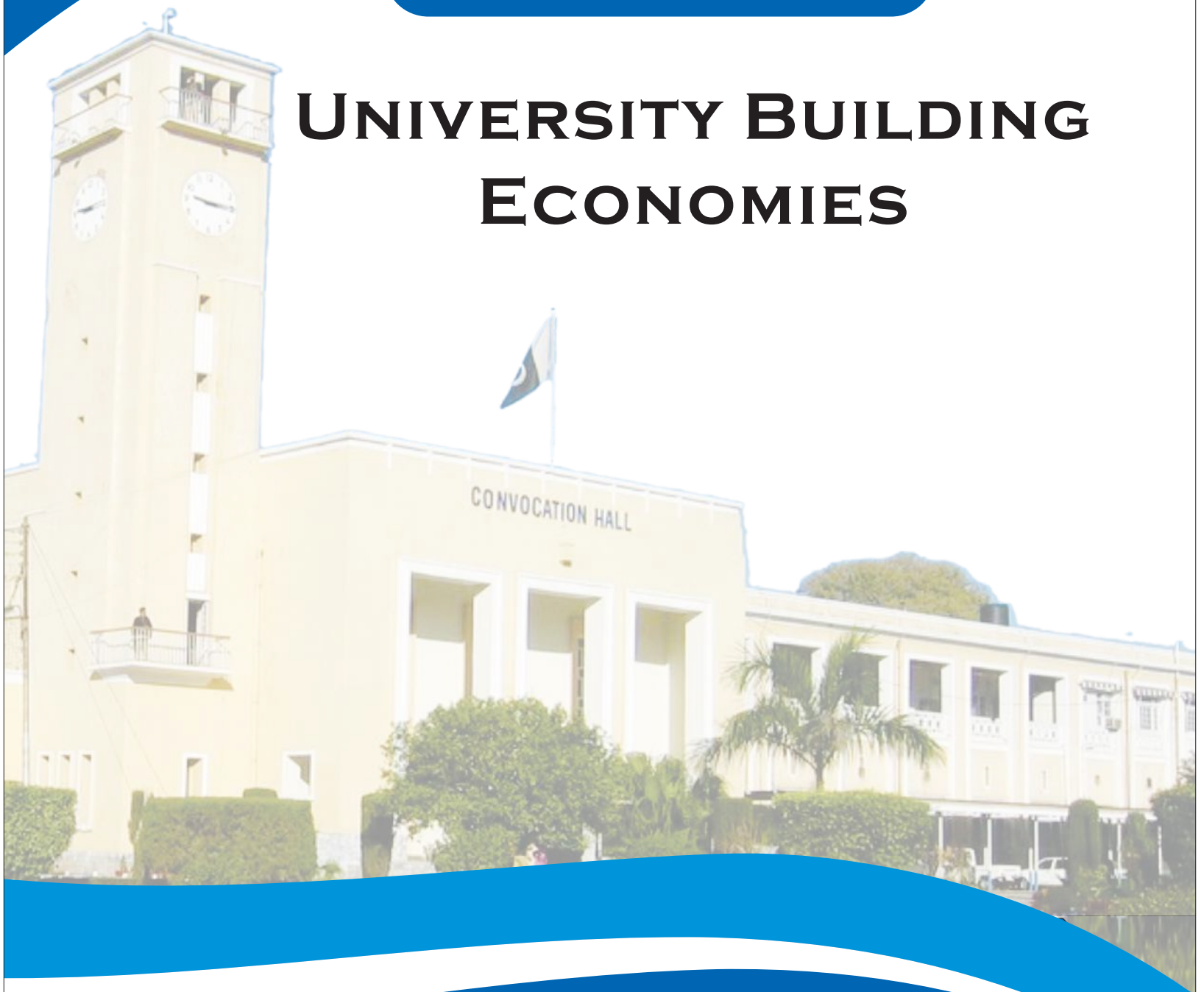
Financial Assistance for the Year 2021-22

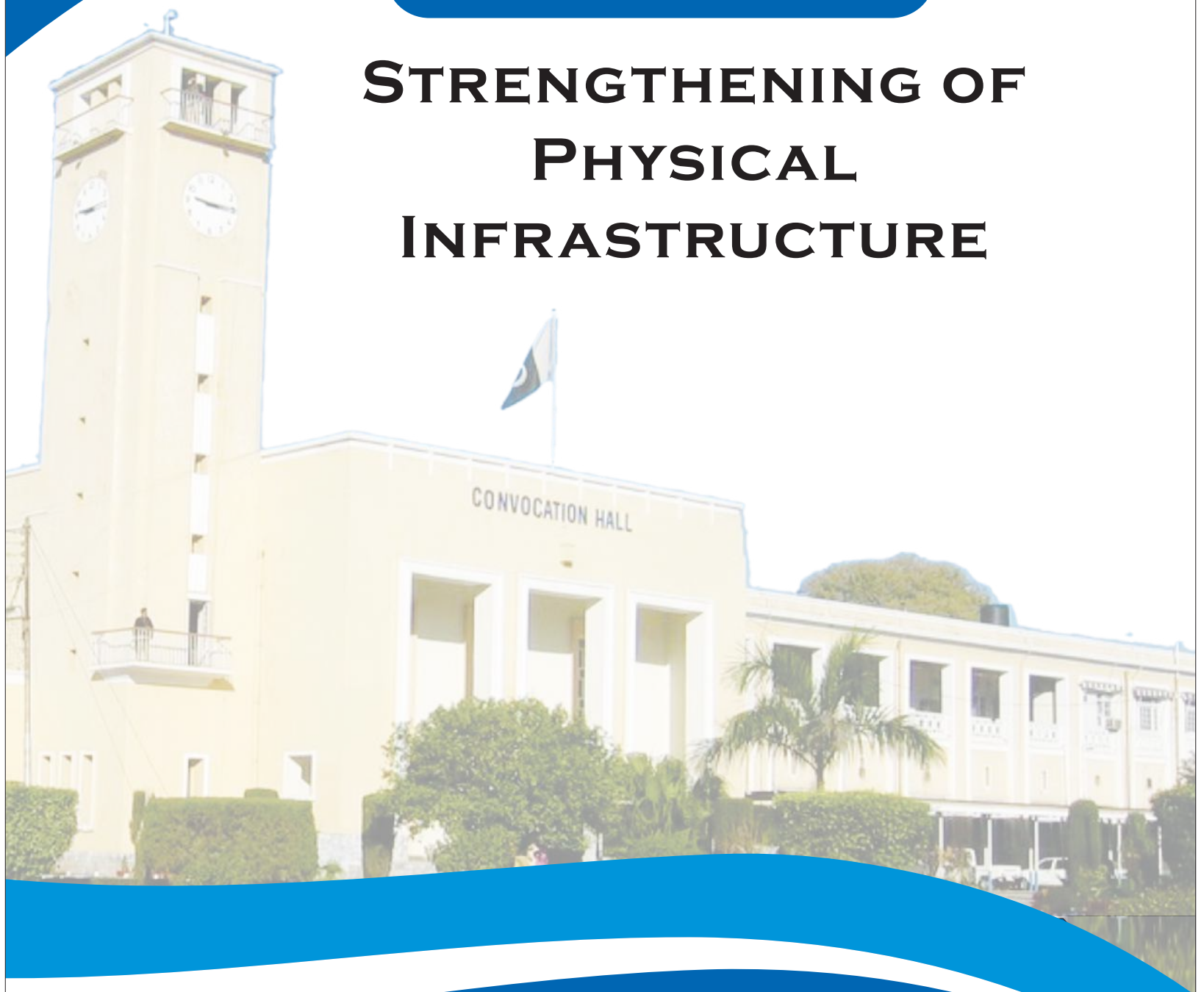

Strengthening Physical Infrastructure

Development Projects (Ongoing)

1. Strengthening of Academic and Professional Facilities at University of Peshawar

The current project is in line with the vision (2025) of Government of Pakistan which has been approved by HEC with a capital cost of Rs. 796.253 for a period of 3 years under Public Sector Development Programme. During the current academic year, civil works component including construction of business incubation centre, upgradation of central library and establishment of modular data centre are ninety percent completed. The other approved allied components are in progress.

Aims and objectives of the Project

a. Research Innovation

If the advance research laboratory is upgraded with sophisticated and modern equipment's as per the need of the time, then the University would be able to contribute by creating conducive environment for carrying out research and developmental activities which is not only beneficial to the researcher and the community, but for the institution as well.

b. Enhancing of Ranking of University

With upgradation of research laboratories researchers would be able to carry out more qualitative type of research, which will ultimately help by improving the University ranking. Moreover, it will also enhance the stature of researcher in view of sophisticated and modern type of equipment as needed for research assignments, hence creating zeal and enthusiasm, for conducting more and more advance research, from micro to macro status.

c. Industrial Linkages

The proposed project establishing therein incubation centres will attract the investors/ researcher / faculty / student who will provide consultancy services in the areas of businesses, horticulture, medicinal plants, fisheries, gemstones, environmental assessment, psychiatry advices, human skill development, competitive test preparation like CSS, PMS etc. This linkage will not only be meant for local people but people living at far flung areas like FATA, PATA, and even cities other than Peshawar. The scope will be expanded in view of inclination of the people in term of demand.

d. Library Automation and Digitalization

i. Library Automation System

At present, the Central Library is utilizing *winsis* software since 2001, which caters to the need of bibliographic information of books and theses only thus having very limited scope and function. In the proposed project, focus will be on implementation of a complete integrated library system, which will automate all the basic library functions and its information leading to enhancing efficiency of library staff on one side and the end users of library on the other side by getting required information for research purposes round the clock.

ii. Development of Digital Repository

To digitize the archival collection (including old theses and dissertations, journals, newspapers, conference proceedings, patents, meetings, agendas and minutes, and other reports) placed in the library. The basic goal of the Digitization Project is to overcome the physical space problems of the library and to make 24/7 accessibility of research products and services to library users.

iii. Development of Internet Cell

The Internet Cell will be equipped with latest computers and high bandwidth internet facility enabling scholars to have easy and fast access to digital repository and HEC digital library, which will save the time of end users.

iv. Audio Visual Corner

To develop an audio-visual corner in the library whereby students will access study material available in DVD, CD and Audio/ Video Cassettes formats and AV Corner will be of great help to visually impaired students.

Laboratory and Research Equipment

1. Centralized Resource Laboratory (Physics)

Introduction

Research laboratories are the basic requirement of any good educational institution, where both the students and teachers (researchers) see the science in its real sense. Research laboratories are so important today that we cannot separate teaching from research in any institution of higher learning. The standard of any institution of higher studies is determined by the quality of research being conducted along with the quality of its graduates produced.

The idea of establishing the Centralized Resource Laboratory (CRL) is to provide facilities to teaching and research community where modern, sophisticated and state of the art equipment are placed. Such equipment are chosen which are of diverse use and are beyond the purchase power of an individual department to avoid duplication of expensive equipments and to get their maximum use. Most of these equipment are housed in the CRL.

The source of funding of these equipments is the Government of Pakistan through HEC. The initial work on the laboratory started in June 2001 and in five years' time, all the equipment were imported, working environment created and equipment were installed. The idea of establishment of CRL is appreciated by the Ministry of Science and Technology and HEC so much that they advised other universities to establish similar laboratories. The laboratory is still in a developing process. Some new equipment have arrived and are under installation process.

This network provides internet and intranet facility to its all academics and administrative departments and Students Teacher hostels.

University of Peshawar has established Centre for IT Services (CITS) to manage all the activities of the overall IT Infrastructure i.e. network development, expansion, maintenance and troubleshooting services i.e. (network, hardware and software), online announcement of examination results as well as uninterrupted internet facility. The Centre is functioning for the smooth and growth of IT infrastructure with 336 Mbps internet bandwidth under Pakistan Education & Research Network (PERN2) Project umbrella. Under Academic Block A & B project network infrastructure and backbone uplink of some department to the main data centre has been upgraded from 1Gpbs to 10Gpbs to cover up future shortcomings.

The Centre provides support and services to maintain the network communication infrastructure, which is required to sustain the IT activities within University premises. Network infrastructure plays a vital role in enabling the high levels of requirement and you need to respond quickly to educational opportunities and challenges. CITS also manages network expansion and enhancement with the passage of requirements and demand.

A University's website is usually the first port of call for many prospective students, and with thousands to choose from across the globe. Thousands of students' worldwide trawl through our website every month in search of the university.

The University official website is designed, developed, and maintained by Centre for IT Services with the aim to showcase the strengths of individual departments and the university as a whole. It is a challenging task to create a website that meets the needs of all and gain huge public attention. An interactive website of the University is currently functional (www.uop.edu.pk) where all the important information regarding admissions, examinations, results, academic & administrative departments, teaching faculty & administrative staff, academic programs and academic activities are timely communicated to the academia/ public.

In 2015 we completed a redesigned of our web templates to make our pages more accessible on mobile and tablet devices. This was the culmination of one-year work and marked a significant change in the way that web pages were delivered by the University of Peshawar. We are now working hard to upgrade as many of our sites as possible to make it more user friendly.

Recently we have added some new modules to the web portal in order to facilitate the students/ academia which includes availability of latest research of academia, our research journals archives, successful graduates information on website, online degree verification portal etc.

Email Services

The Centre provides email addresses to University of Peshawar employees and research students, which facilitates them to interact with the rest of the world securely and efficiently. There are administrative, academic faculty groups in the domains of University of Peshawar which are functional and being utilized for official correspondence.

Microsoft Software Accounts

In order to give access to Microsoft free Software under HEC – Microsoft Academic Alliance, this CITS provides Microsoft DreamSpark account to the students and faculty members which enable them to install licenced software in their laptops/desktop computers for their research activities.

Under Microsoft project, CITS has provided Microsoft ELMS portal having 270 system software, application, designing and databases to our students and faculty. Similarly, the Office 365 account/services have been provided more than 390 users.

Biometric System

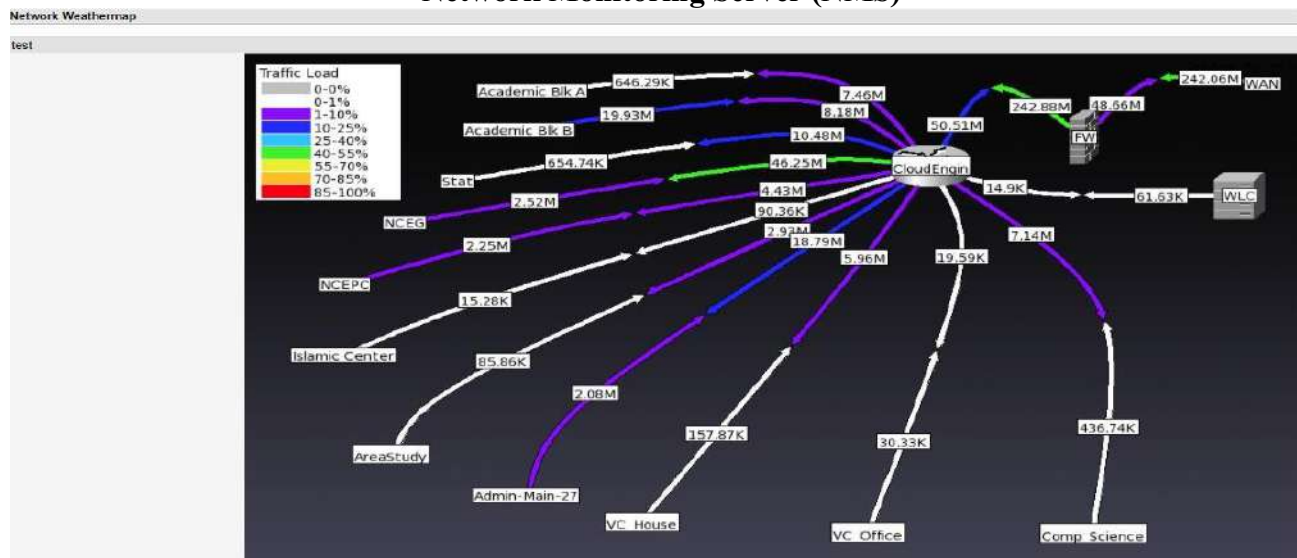
The University deployed the biometric based attendance system to ensure the attendance of administrative/ non-teaching staff of the University. Monitoring System

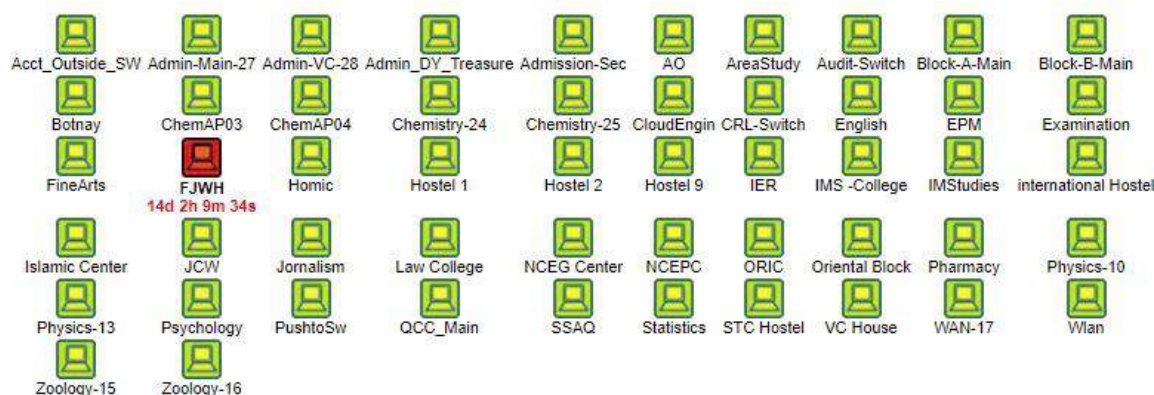

Network Monitoring Server (NMS)

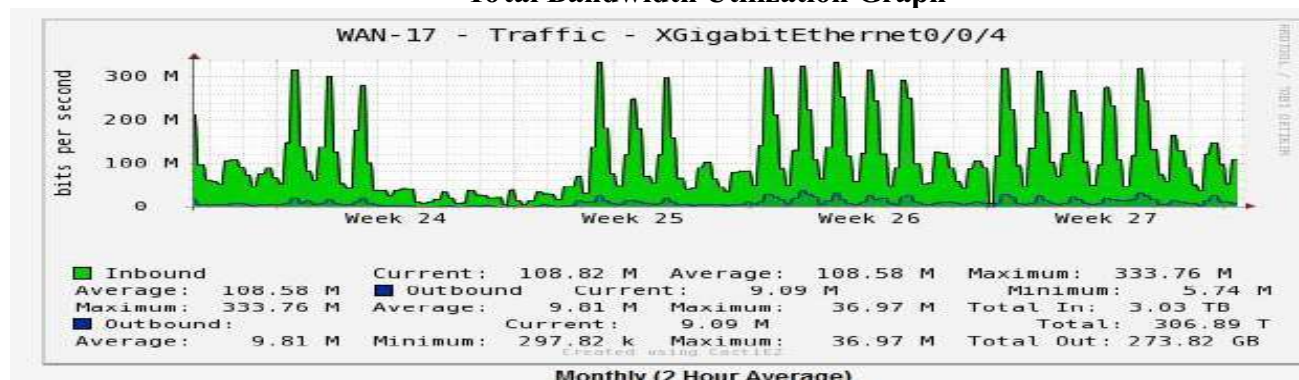

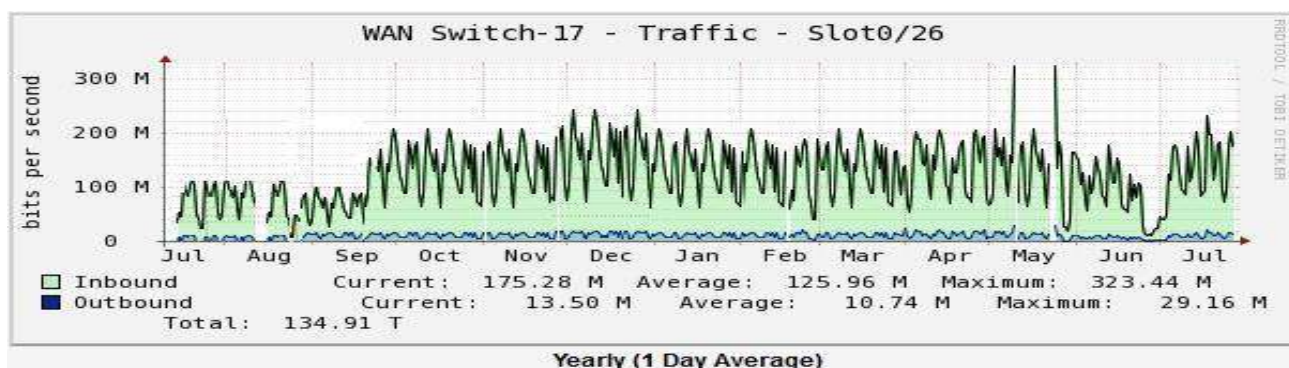

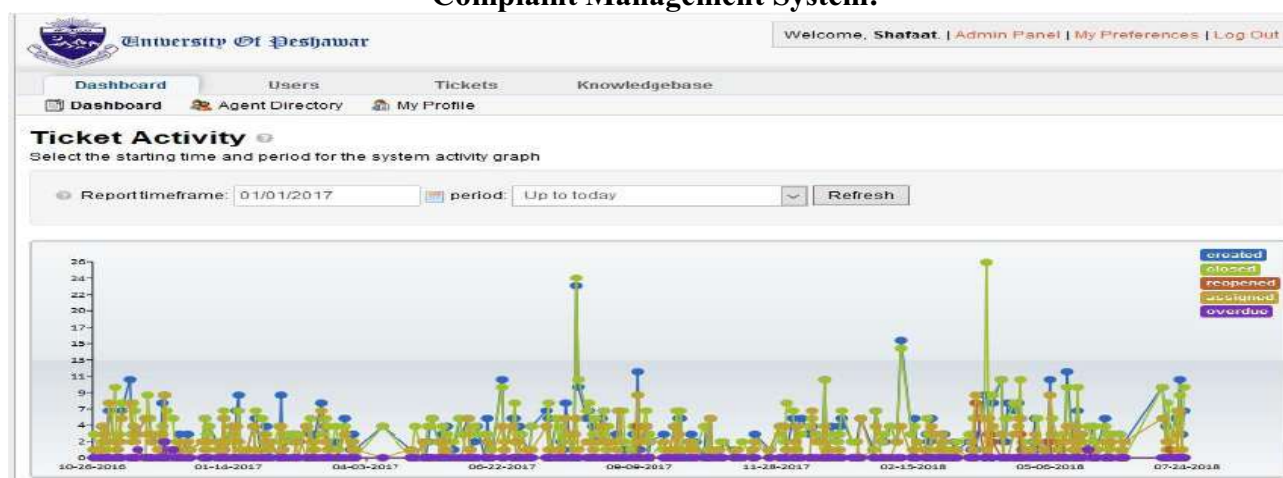
Total Bandwidth Utilization Graph

Keep in view the current era's requirements and financial position of University, CITS suggested developing/Procuring HR software for the University of Peshawar. The software development has been completed and Data entry digitization from the employee's personal file is in progress.

Academic Block A & B Networking Project

CITS has successfully completed the networking project in Academic Block A and B where 50 access switches and 20 Access point with access controller has been installed. Furthermore, under the same project the core network is strengthened and secured by installing Fortinet Firewall 500D, Huawei Firewall, Huawei Core Switch and 04 Servers in the Server Room,

Open Wi-Fi Project

Centre for IT Services deployed Open Wi-Fi Project funded by Directorate of IT Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, which includes optical fibre, network switches and (16) access points at appropriate (05) locations, Student Teacher Centre (STC), Academic Block 1 & 2, Central Library, Madina Market on the university premises with a bandwidth of 20Mbps. A login portal for online student registration and internet usage in support to online module will be provided for internet access through this Centre.

Directorate of IT, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa initiate this project with the motive that internet is for every one and it should be open for access the internet resources. Such wireless network access service will help students in their research and education activity with mobility.

Government College Video Conferencing /PERN Project

Under PERN project, HEC has approved a project for University of Peshawar with its affiliated collage namely Government College, Peshawar regarding PERN connectivity along with video conferencing equipment. IT relevant equipment were installed through Centre for IT Services with 8Mbps internet bandwidth. The video conferencing equipment such as CODEC, HD camera and audio amplifier were provided and commissioned by the HEC.

The project was completed on 25-08-2018 and inaugurated by the Registrar, University of Peshawar and Director IT respectively with Focal Person of the project.

Smart and Safe University Project

This project was initiated in year 2015 and an agreement was signed between UoP and HEC for Smart Campus (Wi-Fi) after the critical security situation in the country specially after Bacha Khan University incident. HEC intends to facilitate the Universities to improve their campus security in befitting manner. HEC also incorporate Wi-Fi project into “**Smart & Safe Campus Project**”. It was decided by HEC that small universities will be entertained in 1st phase while the large universities, like UoP, were kept in 4th phase. Nevertheless, due to security threats to campus Centre for IT Services and Worthy Vice Chancellor approached the HEC to include University of Peshawar in 2nd phase. Due to that security agencies were persistently asking the University to secure its campus on top priority. HEC included University of Peshawar in 2nd phase. Equipment for the project has been received on 29/09/2018 and deployment work will be started from 01/10/2018.

Smart and Safe campus project which includes 775 access points for smart university, 192 boundary wall camera and 672 surveillance camera system that will be installed at department entry/exit, road and parking. The project will be hopefully completed in 2018.

Data Center

In order to cope up with the rapid changing technology and the requirement of the academia it is very essential to keep update our existing network/system/technology; comprising of data center on one hand while the clients on the other hand. As we are well aware that after every 24 months computer processing demands become double. It means that we find the Latest Technology devices "Networking Devices" in the market every year and even that every month. So in our existing network we have to add the latest technology devices to fulfill requisite requirement, which are not possible with our Existing network.

Keeping in view of the data growth and research requirement, Center for IT Services (CITS) had deployed a state of the art data center under the project Strengthening of Academic & Professional Facilities at University of Peshawar with the total project cost of 57Million. Data Center will be

operational after full migration of optical fiber, servers/services from old data center to the new data center. This upgradation will enhance uptime, security, availability of services and resources, ease of management and single source facilities management.

Also we would like to mention that Campus Management Solutions comprising of students complete life cycle and implementation of Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) is already deployed and running in our data center. It will contribute its role in the academia uplifting and will certainly share in research and industrial commercialization.

Future Projects and Plan

Centre for IT Services plans to make its Centre and the relevant Network to state-of-the-art by putting cognitive and human development inputs. Centre looks forward the authorities to support us in our objectives. Similarly, we have the intentions for adequate internet bandwidth increase to meet the demand which will in result cover-up the entire hostels and residential areas in befitting method. Such process will enhance their capability and skills to meet their daily official correspondence in professional way.

University Management and Biometric Security System

The Centre has prepared PC-1 for University Management System, Biometric / RFID based security system having different modules to facilitate the University academics and administrative departments in different aspects.

Project for Client / Dumb Terminal Labs

The Centre for IT Services is also in the process of preparing PC-1 for more than 500 client/dumb terminals for labs purpose in different academic departments. This will be certainly will be used for their academic purpose as well as for NTS and different online exams to generate revenue.

National and Vocational Technical Training Commission Project.

The Centre for IT Services is also in the process of preparing Project for 15 technical Trades for the project to submit under kamyab jawan program.

Digital Library

The Central Library is located in the main administration Block of the University of Peshawar. The Central Library was established in February 1951. Initially it was housed in a small room in the old Central Training College building (presently The Agricultural Research Centre, adjacent to Khyber Teaching Hospital). The library then shifted to the University Science Block. It was later on transferred to the present premises in 1957. The Central Library has just gone through a massive uplift and renovation under the project “Strengthening of Academic and Professional Facilities at University of Peshawar”. This project was an essential part of the general reform and restructuring process that the university has embarked upon to cope with the space problem and provide a congenial environment to its users.

The existing 4-storey building with an area of 16000 sq. ft. (approx.) The library has 1,78000 volumes in addition to 696 precious manuscripts of oriental languages version.

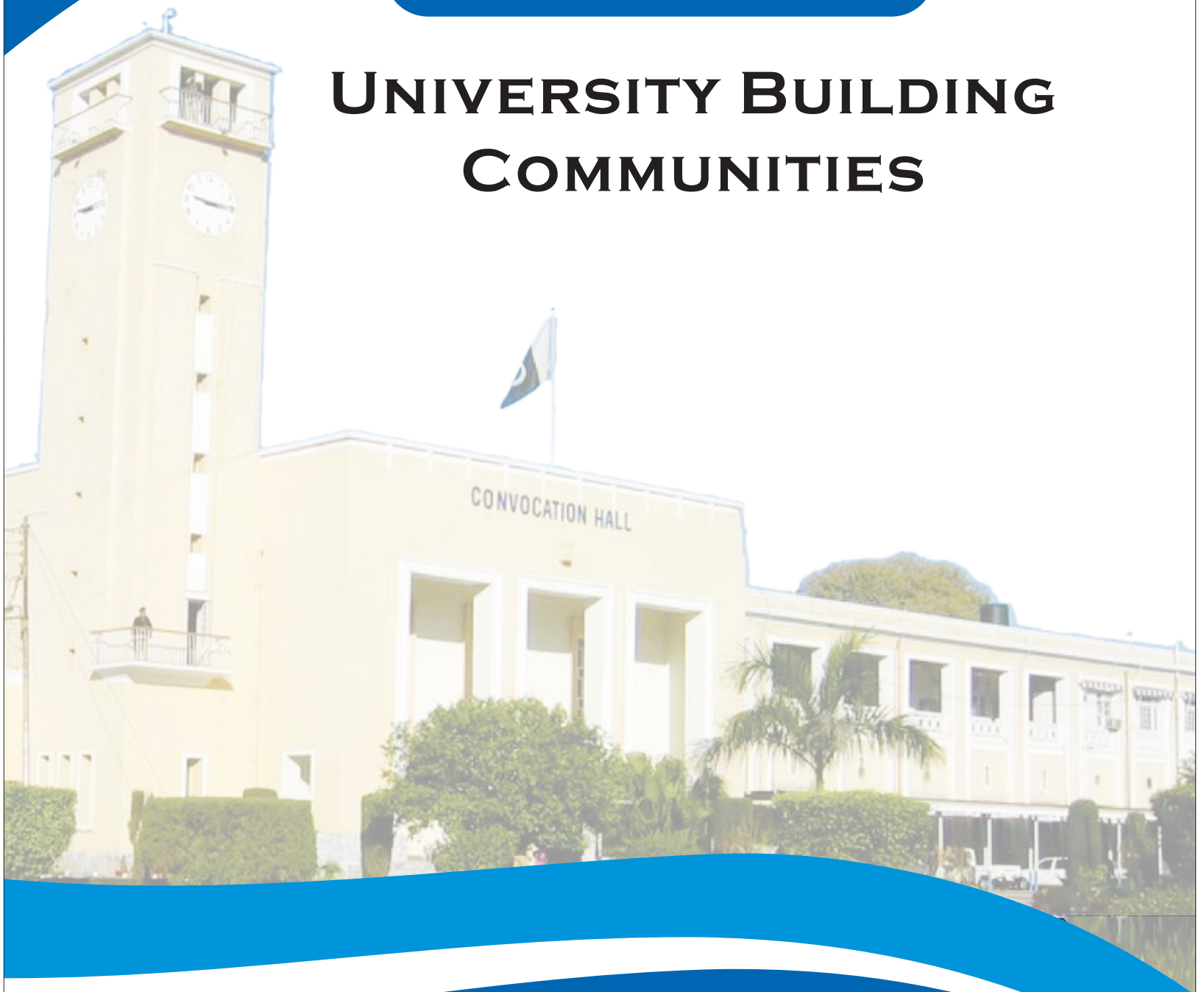

These implementing partners will offer expertise in higher education, university design, administrative leadership, student support, research, curriculum development, and graduate preparedness to help Pakistan reach its potential in delivering competitive graduates to the global workforce.

The project aims to reinforce the country's higher education system by capacity building of HEIs. The five-year project will serve as an impetus to enhance graduate employability and improve relevance, adequacy and inclusivity vis-à-vis the higher education ecosystem of Pakistan. HESSA's project will encompass baseline studies, strategic plans, international higher education summits, study tours to the US universities, and inclusive financial aid system for students. Community Service Program (CSP), University of Peshawar

Executive Summary

Community service is gradually becoming an essential component of academic learning in universities across the globe. The scholars in universities like Oxford, Cambridge, Harvard, Pennsylvania, Boston, and others regularly engage in performing different forms of community service thereby promoting goodwill within the society at large.

Higher Education Commission of Pakistan encourages universities to carry out essential community services to inculcate civic sense and goodwill amongst students and faculty alike.

University of Peshawar offers numerous services to on-campus residents, students and has a dedicated Directorate of Community Service Program headed by the Director and assisted by departmental coordinators, student interns and others.

Community Service Program is an academic body of the University of Peshawar that guides and engages the students of bachelors' degree program in contributing their services on voluntary basis to the different segments of society. It has a non-bureaucratic structure and carries out its activities through student interns, departmental coordinators and all the bachelors' degree students at the University.

The community services by CSP office are divided into three categories:

Services by CSP office

Services by students as degree requirement

Services by students other than degree requirements

The community services ranges from plantation, beautification of the community, blood donation camps, literacy campaigns, tutoring in high schools, science exhibitions, awareness campaigns, child labor campaigns, Flood Relief Campaigns, and others.

Community Service program (CSP) was previously known as Social Work Program. It is a mandatory voluntary community activity for the regular students on the rolls of constituent, professional, affiliated colleges, teaching departments, and institutes of the University of Peshawar that are preparing students for the 1st degree examinations (bachelors). Since 1974-75, the program was limited to BA, B.Sc, B.Com (two years bachelors program) of affiliated colleges. It was in 2015 that the Social Work program was renamed and reformed as the Community Service Program (CSP). Now it is an essential component of the BS 04 Year program of all the students at the University of Peshawar and its affiliated colleges. The reforms were brought through an amendment in Social Work Regulations 1974-75 of the University of Peshawar. Any student enrolled in any BS program is not awarded the degree by the Office of the Controller of Examinations, University of Peshawar without completing the community service work and producing a clearance certificate from the office of the Director CSP.

Vision

"Building responsible citizens with a sense of compassion, civility and initiative ability to solve community problems with self-help spirit".

Mission

"To provide education to students with social responsibility by engaging them in community oriented work to become active members of their community that has a long lasting, positive impact on society at large. Community service also aims to develop a sense of volunteerism which enables students to acquire life skills and knowledge, as well as provide a service to those who need it most."

Objectives

Key objectives of CSP

- To develop a sense of dignity for labour among the students;
- To engage graduate students in community-oriented work for the general welfare of society.
- To provide a platform to graduate students to channelize their energies in constructive activities.
- To develop and inculcate a sense of social and civic responsibility amongst the graduating students; and
- To strengthen the awareness of the students of affiliated Colleges and University of Peshawar regarding designing and implementing social oriented projects.

The complexities of modern policing require law enforcement agencies to expand how police-force is trained to do their jobs. It is not sufficient for training to focus solely on the law or on perishable skills, such as arrest and control; defensive tactics; driving; and firearms. Effective policing required a unique combination of physical, cognitive, emotional, and interpersonal skills. After the devastating wave of terrorism, Nasir Durrani played pivotal role in restoring the morale of police and then boosts their professional efficiency that given KP Police as a professionally sound front-line forces in Pakistan. These efforts are evident and can be observed during extensive pre-service, in-service, mid-career training at the Police Training College (PTC) at Hangu. I observe and experience these developments during my two days visit to PTI as Trainer for sharing Steps and Techniques of Social Research Methodologies and Contemporary Andragogical Methods to the new recruits' and mid-career police force. Mr. Fasihudin (PSP) as Commandant of the PTC has further enriched the training capacity of the Institute with modern and contemporary skills and strategies.

Kitab Dost Session “He who is greedy is always in want”. Tuesday October 2021

One of the major activities of Kitab Dost is a small Rakshaw van named “*Dastango*” (story teller). This van is designed to be taken to the children of slum areas and ghettos and narrate stories to them and distribute story books amongst the children. The van was taken to the the Ujala School at Hayatabad by Ms. Naila Mehmood and Mr. Arif Khan, CSP volunteers. Over 50 students were provided the opportunity to enter into the *Dastango* van. The CSP volunteers also narrated the story “*Baraa Maheney*” (twelve months) to the students.

The story was about the 12 months, an old woman and her greedy neighbor.

Through the story our children learnt that “greed is rightly a curse as it results in humiliation and disgrace”.

The students listened to the story very attentively and thoroughly enjoyed it. Books were also issued to our little children to be read at home.



Visit of Zamong Kor Team to UoP facilitated by CSP

A visit to the CSP Office, University of Peshawar was made by the Staff of Zamong Kor (ZK) on 21/12/2021 for exploring collaborative ventures for the grooming of state children enrolled at ZK. ZamungKor has been established by the KP Government in order to create an equitable and conducive

Dr. Syed Munir IER, Ms. Nasira Nasreen, Department of Social Work, Dr. Shakeel Ahmed, Director Community Services Program, UoP and 20 students of the Clinical Psychology of the UoP, have visited Zamong Kor on 03/01/2022 which is a model institute established for the destitute children in Peshawar by KP Government. The visit is paid on the request of the Director Zamong Kor Syed Mazar Ali Shah during his visit (along with his team) to the University of Peshawar on 25/12/2021 for exploring collaborative ventures for enhancing the training and grooming of enrolled state children. In the meeting, he met with the Vice Chancellor, University of Peshawar where joint interests were demonstrated by both Heads for collaborative efforts to train children.

During the visit, a detailed presentation was given by the Director Zamong Kor which was followed by extensive visits to different sections of the institute such as hostels, classrooms, computer labs and dines. More than 600 hundred children are currently enrolled in the institute who are receiving high class services under the supervision of trained teachers and psychologists.

As a goodwill gesture to the children of Zamong Kor (ZK), Community Service Program (CSP) of the University of Peshawar through her partner Dosti Welfare Organization (DWO) has gifted stationary for more than 600 students on 06/01/2022. DWO is a local non-profit organization working for the promotion of education of underprivileged children in Pakistan. On the occasion, along with the staff of the ZK, members of the Board of Governance of Zamong Kor were also present on the occasion.



Accessibility Hurdles at UoP: A Meeting to Assess the Situation

On 10.02.2022, a meeting of the representative of the Friends of Paraplegic, Peshawar Engineer Irfan, Eng. UoP Accessibility Audit Report by FoP

Friends of Paraplegics are on its way to make the University of Peshawar accessible for everyone. Briefly report shared with the University of Peshawar regarding accessibility of newly constructed buildings. Very soon further accessibility will be ensured in renovation phase as well as other buildings will be added in PC-1.



Accessibility Audit of the Newly Constructed Buildings at the University of Peshawar

Higher Education of Pakistan (HEC)'s policy for Students with Disability 2021 aims to create an enabling environment in the Higher Education Sector to not only motivate students with disabilities to undertake higher education, but also facilitates their participation in all academic and extra-curricular aspects of a university education.

In this regard, team of experts of the Friends of Paraplegic (FsP) Peshawar, headed by Engineer Irfan (GS FsP) conducted Accessibility Audit of the Newly Constructed Building of the Institute of Criminology & Forensic Sciences and Incubation Centre University of Peshawar. FoP is the partner Organization of the Community Service Program (CSP), University of Peshawar and Department of Social Work, University of Peshawar through an MoU signed in October 2021. Under the MoU, the partner organizations have to take all possible measures to make the University of Peshawar as Disable- Friendly Institute in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Furthermore, the already constructed building of the Sheikh Taimur Academic Block-1 was also audited and found inaccessibility for the students with disability. The ramps at the entrance and exit of the building were recommended to be re-designed soon as Model Step for the rest of the buildings of the UoP. The experts will submit their detailed audit report soon to the Planning and Development (P & D) Department of the University of Peshawar for taking necessary action in this regard.



Community Activities with Handicap International

Disability Inclusive Development: One Day Seminar (11.08.2021)

One Day Orientation Session on Disability Inclusive Development organized by the Social Welfare Society of Khyber Medical College, Peshawar at KMC on 11/08/2021 in collaboration with Handicapped International, Islamabad and CSP, University of Peshawar.



In talk with Mr. Iqbal: “The Ability” not ‘Disability’ (14.10.2021)

Mr. Muhammad Iqbal who cannot see but possesses a remarkable vision of making his surrounding a better place for Person with Different Abilities (PWDA). He has proved with his extra ordinary talent that there is no concept of Disability in his life rather he is the person with “The Ability”. He has multiple innovative ideas regarding inclusion and accessibility of PWDA. Currently, he is working on a key position at Handicap International (HI) Islamabad. He visited the Department of Social Work, University of Peshawar for collaborative work for promoting the rights of PWDA. He is the graduate of University of Peshawar and made us feel proud that he remained our student.



One Day Seminar on Disability Inclusive Response in Pandemic (14.10.2021)

The Community Services Program (CSP), University of Peshawar has organized one Day ‘Orientation Session on ‘Disability Inclusive Response in Pandemic’ in collaboration with Handicap International on 14th October, 2021 at the Conference Hall of the Sir Sahibzada Abdul Qayyum Khan Archeology Museum here at University of Peshawar. The session was attended by over 200 students from all departments of the University of Peshawar. Mr. Muhammad Iqbal, gender, age and disability Advisor of the Handicap International and CEO of Paraplegic Peshawar Mr. Ilyas Syed were the keynote speakers who presented their life-long field and research-oriented experience with the participants. The seminar was presided over by the Vice Chancellor, University of Peshawar Prof. Dr. Muhammad Idrees.



Education and Climate Change: International Day of Education celebrated on January 24, 2022

International Day of Education was celebrated on 24.01.2022 at the Institute of Education and Research (IER), University of Peshawar. The celebration was organized by the Community Service Program, University of Peshawar in collaboration with Dosti Welfare Organization and IER.

In the inaugural session, it was highlighted by the Director IER that University of Peshawar is the first institution in Pakistan that celebrated this day. After inaugural ceremony, the program was divided into three parallel sessions i.e. first session was conducted with the theme of Current Curricula: Promoting Master Narrative OR Developing Critical thinking wherein Dr. Altaf Qadir (History), Prof. Dr. Ghulam Qasim Marwat (Former Director Higher Education Academy for Research and Training, known as HEART), Dr. Darvesh Afridi (Gender Studies) discussed that curriculum development and its implementation at all levels of education is an important area of research and practice. Having robust and well-attuned curricula at the respective levels of education needs to have all the facets of producing educated and enlightened citizens, who contribute to society and the nation's progress, prosperity, and economic development. However, gaps in and problems of curriculum implementation lead to severe implications and repercussions for students and graduates who may not be able to play their due part and role in society. In the second parallel session Dr. Sohail Ahmad (Urdu), Dr. Kashif Saeed (Economics), Dr. Syed Munir Ahmad (IER) and Hafiz Inamullah (IER) spoke on the topic of Education: The Best Investment and shared that the interplay between education and investment dynamics, thereby leading to and arriving at an academic conclusion that contribute to the policy debate in education. In the 3rd parallel session Prof. Dr. Muhammad Rauf (IER), Dr. Amjad Reba (IER), Dr. Parveen Khan (IER) shared their expert views on the importance of civic education for Sustainable Development.

On successful completion of the first session followed by a tea break, the second parallel session started with the different thematic areas i.e. Constitution of Pakistan, Article 25A: Right to Education & SDG 4 wherein Mr. Asif Riaz (Dosti), Dr. Ghulam Qasim Marwat and Dr. Shakeel Ahmed (CSP) debated the issues and problems underpinning access to free and compulsory education of all children, ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education, and providing quality education to everyone irrespective of their social class, religion, gender. The second parallel session reflected upon the technology in the Classroom: Benefits and Effects which were elaborated by Dr. Faiz Ullah Jan (Journalism), Dr. Imran Ahmad Sajid (Social Work) and Dr. Shaukat Ali (Computer Science) with justification that Smartphones, computers, and tablets are already an omnipresent element of everyday life for students and teachers alike. It's only natural that technological devices in the classroom are explored to create meaningful learning experiences for students of all ages. Utilizing different types of technology in the classroom, including a virtual classroom, creates learners who are actively engaged with learning objectives. The implementation of technology also creates pathways for differentiated instruction to meet the unique needs of students as individual learners within a broader classroom climate. In the 3rd parallel session, Dr. Hafiz Muhammad Inamullah, Dr. Syed Munir Ahmad, Dr. Muhammad Rauf reflected upon the topic of School Effectiveness wherein they shared that School effectiveness encapsulates both material and human resources and their deployment. It uses that the school resources are effectively and judiciously used. Principals, teachers, support staff, and parents are in sync and make concerted efforts to create a conducive learning environment. Since student learning focuses on school effectiveness, their active participation in learning makes a school an effective one. In this perspective, the theme of School Effectiveness aims to lay bare the nuances and dimensions that impinge upon the quality and effectiveness of our public schools, specifically and private schools generally.

The last parallel session was held on the topic of Student Learning: Theory and Practice wherein Dr. Nadeem Khan, Dr. Jehanzeb Khan, Dr. Siraj Khan shared that Student learning is of primary importance in the context of educational institutions. However, in most developing or underdeveloped countries, teaching and learning are far from ideal.

In the last, the students of IER presented a stage play with the theme of Interactive Play on Education with the message that Drama and Theatre are both pivotal outlets for self-expression and using drama as a teaching tool; students are intellectually, physically, socially, or emotionally involved in every way. The use of drama and art in education leads to holistic learning, accelerates personality development, and imparts students with crucial life skills, problem-solving skills, leadership, cooperation, and collaboration.



Seminar on Prevalence of Genetic Diseases (12.10.2021)

The Department of Social Work (DSW) and Community Service Program (CSP), University of Peshawar has organized one day awareness seminar on “Prevalence of the Genetic Diseases; Strategies

to Control Genetic Diseases” with Dosti Welfare Organization and Centre of Biotechnology and Microbiology, University of Peshawar on 12th October, 2021 (10:00 am to 03:00 pm) at the Sir Sahibzada Abdul Qayum Hall of Archeological Museum Conference hall at University of Peshawar. The purpose of the seminar was to discuss the causes and prevention of different genetic disease such as Thalassemia, sickle cell Anaemia, Colour blindness, Haemophilia, Deafness, etc. on this occasion, Prof Dr. Zahid Anwar, Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Peshawar was the chief guest who highlighted the role of social scientists and social sciences in exploring the socio-cultural factors responsible for genetic disorders.

Prof. Sumera Afzal, Director Centre of Bio-technology and microbiology discusses the causes of genetic diseases which usually arise when a mutation in our DNA takes place. Some genetic diseases are hereditary, while some disorders are acquired genetic disorders. Hereditary disorders are those disorders that can transfer from parents to their offspring. Dr. Ibrar Khan, Associate Professor of Biotechnology discuss the sickle cell diseases and shared that in Pakistan, about 5000 to 10000 kids are born with thalassemia annually, while 15000 to 25000 are born as the carriers of the disease. It is a blood-inherited disorder in which the genes responsible for normal hemoglobin production become mutated.

The seminar was attended more than 180 students and faculty members across the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.



Transforming World through Education: Dosti Welfare Organization

Dosti School as ‘Model school’ are designed for the underprivileged children, located in Sufaid Dheri, a small sub-urban area in Peshawar. ‘Dosti Schools’ are the outcome of the dream of Dr. Munir Ahmad who wishes to educate the whole Pakistan. Dr. Munir is a Pakistan born doctor settled in the United States. He got his education with extremely limited resources and became a medical doctor. After life struggle, he reached to a position where he could live a life with luxuries in the US but he decided to pay back to his own land and local people who cannot afford education. He provides a platform for producing more Dr. Munirs, which is possible only through education. There is a network of Dosti Schools working not only in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa but in Sindh, Baluchistan and even, one Dosti School is running in Afghanistan. It runs through the idea of self-help. Dosti Team, visits places where there is either no school or school unaffordable for low-income families. They establish school with the participation of local motivated people in their localities. Dosti provides them training, help them financially for some time, recruit local people as teachers, when it starts running, they hand over it to the local people to run. At any stage, if school management needs the assistance of Dosti Team, they visit them and help them out.

Few days back, I received a phone call from Mr. Asif Riaz who is the Chief Executive of Dosti Welfare Organization, and the actual person behind perusing the DREAM of Dr. Munir on modern, professional, dedicated, self-help manner. He invited me to visit under-renovation Dosti School. On reaching there I found no outsiders; but all the Dosti Team members, teachers, drivers, carpenters etc. busy in refining and re-designing the school. They have totally changed the appearance of the school (Dr. Shakeel, Director CSP).

Mr. Asif Riaz said that he wants to “transform the paradigm of Dosti Model from Charity to Self-reliant Model”, i.e. the low income children will receive education on extremely subsidized rates but those families who can afford fee of their children, will be charged with nominal rates. The income from the privilege class will be the only source, based on the philosophy, “Generate resources for running the school”. It has become possible because the school is giving conducive environment and quality education. Dosti has provided facilities more than a Beacon House or the City School (play tools, LED, AC, etc).



F. HRF Training to CSP Volunteers

After distribution of Ramadan gifts and sponsorship of semester fees for the deserving students (worth of Rs 750000), Human Relief Foundation (HRF) as partner of Community Service Program (CSP) and Department of Social Work, University of Peshawar has recruited two Graduates of Social Work as HRF Employees.

**Community Service for the preservation of birds species**

The event started with the welcome address of Dr. Shakeel Ahmed who highlighted the role of community services program at the University of Peshawar in inculcating civic sense among the youth for better change in society. On the occasion Mr. Rehmand Badshah CEO of AID International shared milestones achieved in the past one year. The day was inaugurated by the Special Assistant to Chief Minister on Information and public relation Barrister Muhammad Ali Saif as Chief Guest who appreciated the efforts of the students in addressing such an important issue and welcome University of Peshawar to collaborate in future endeavors. 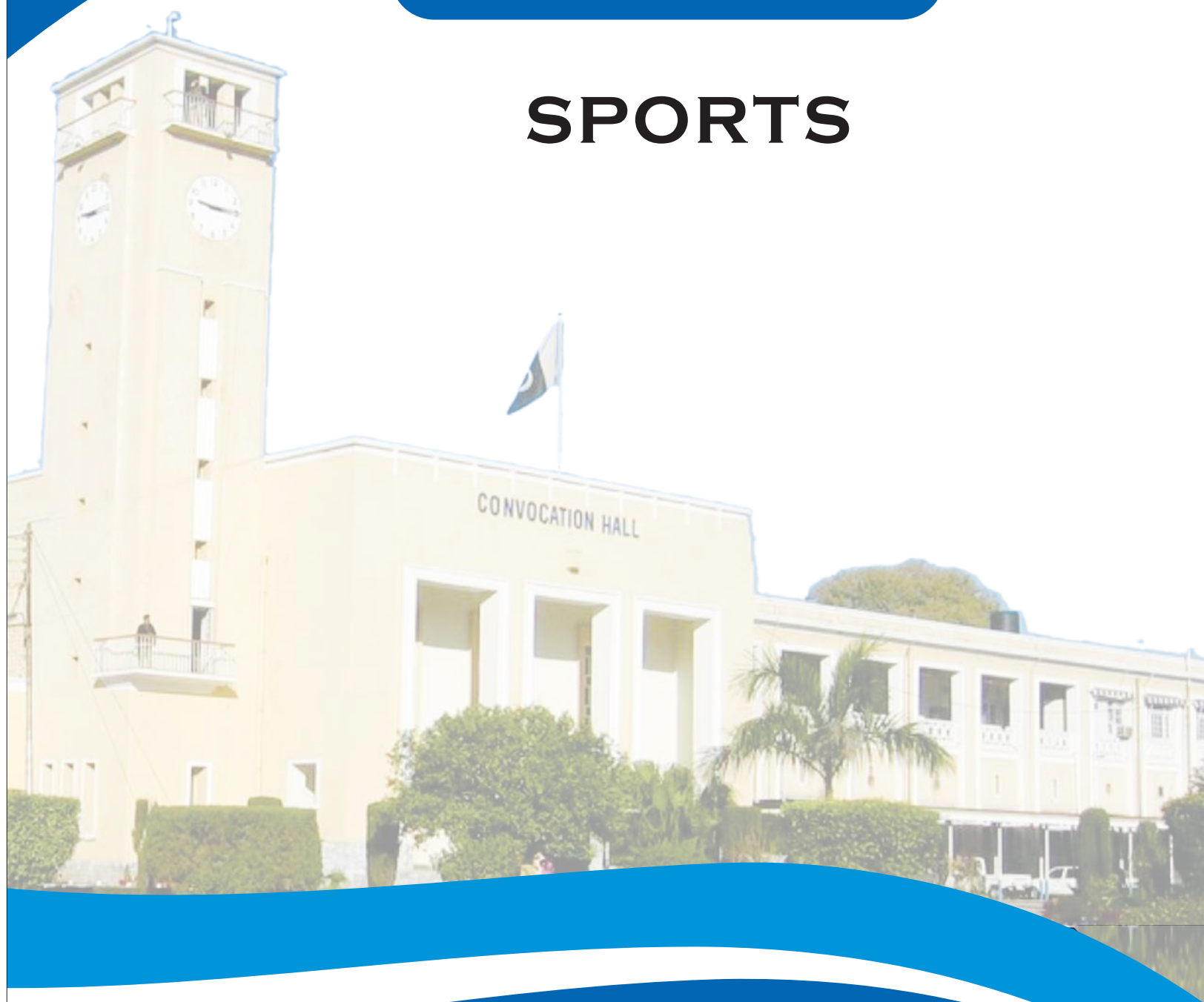
The Mirror of Society

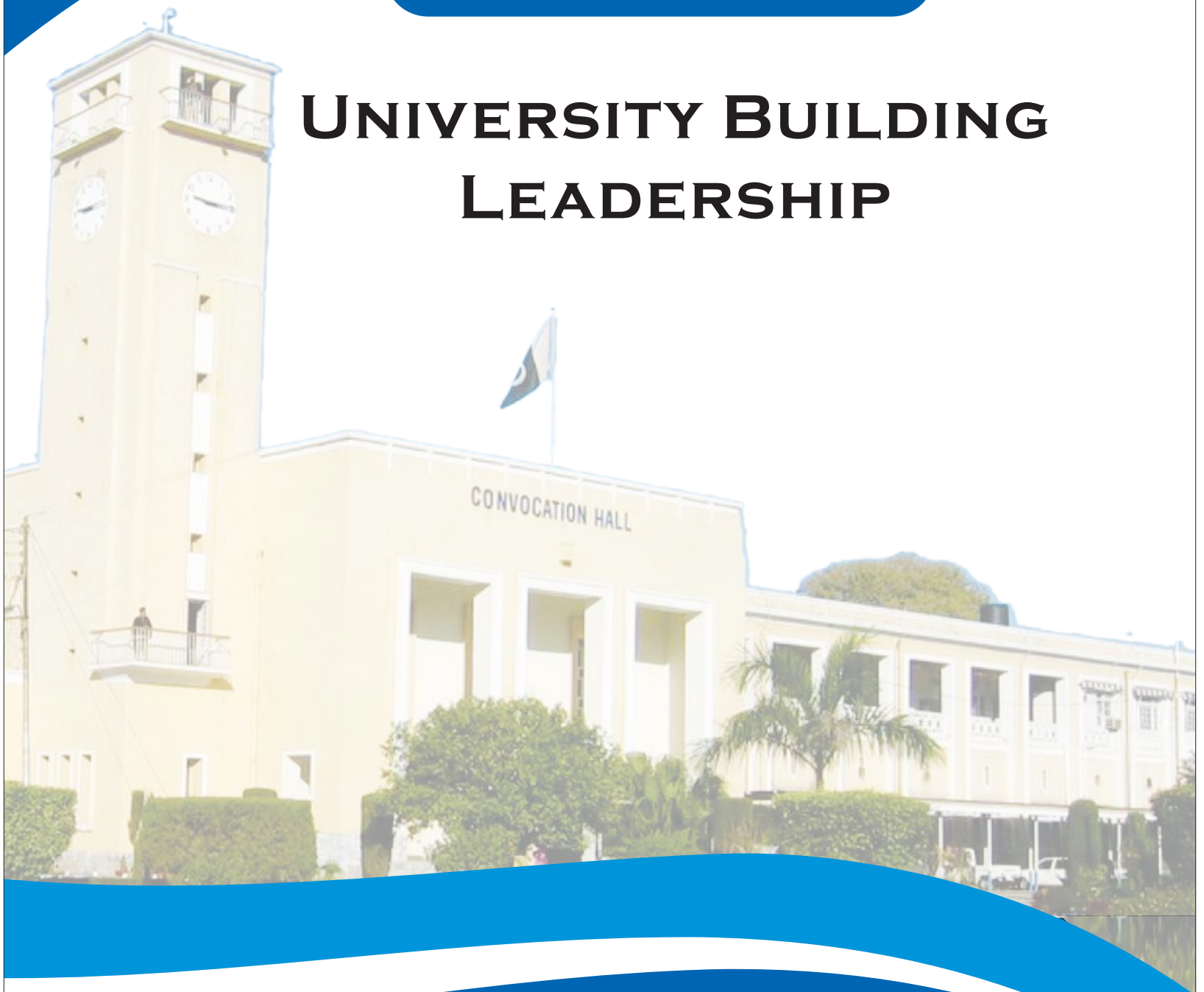

Introduction











For the overall development, one must be good at not only in academics but also in sports, cultural activities, mannerism and above all, the ethics of life. Students Societies believe that a true education occurs both inside and outside of the classroom. In Students Societies, we strive to ensure a positive educational and co-curricular experience for all students by concentrating on the out-of-class experiences. Our aim is to build a cohesive and resilient society, deepening the sense of national identity and affinity through promoting arts and heritage, youth engagements, sports development, volunteerism and philanthropy. High academic excellence coupled with moral rectitude, intellectual integrity, sound aesthetic sense etc., is the essence of Students Societies. Students Societies are here to arrange events and activities, and foster experiences that serve to complement academic experiences socially, culturally and emotionally. Our mission is simple, and objective is clear. For every student of University of Peshawar to be better and brighter than they were when they arrived, by putting students at the center of all we do and with the goal of helping them reach their true potential.

Khyber Literary Club established in 1986 as a pioneer society, got its legal status in 1994 with the decision of the Honourable Supreme Court, whereby an alternate platform was provided to the students to ward them off the undesirable political activities, where they were enslaved by venomous designs of political parties. In the light of this ruling, later on, 13 more societies namely Adventure and Hiking Club, Blood Donors Society, Creative Art Society, Culture and Dramatic society, Sport Society, Science Society, Character Building, Social Welfare and Awareness Society, Creative Art Society, Khyber Islamic Cultural Society, International Students Society, Young Women Club, Student Movement for Green Campus and Environment Society were established. Today Students Societies comprise of following thirteen societies.

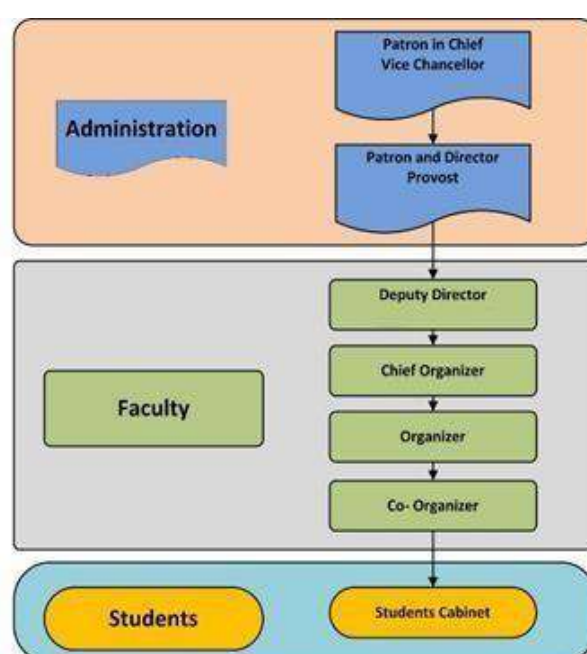
Vice Chancellor and Provost of University of Peshawar are the Chief Patron and Patron respectively of all the Societies. Each society is managed by an Organizer and Co-Organizer. Under the overall supervision of a Chief Organizer, student's cabinet of each society works under the guidance of its respective Organizers. The cabinet of each society bears offices of a President, Vice President, General Secretary, Joint Secretary, Media Secretary and Public Relation Officer (1 male and 1 female). Session of the Students Societies is connected with the Academic Session which normally starts in September and continues to the end of August of next year.

Responsibilities of Organizers and Co-Organizers:

- All the persons involved in the Co-curricular activities of University of Peshawar would act according to the "Charter of Students Societies, University of Peshawar", which would be promulgated in the near future after the approval of the competent authority.
- The Chief Organizer would act as Chairman of Students Societies.
- Each Society will be headed by an Organizer and one or two Co-Organizers keeping in view the work load and business of a Society.
- The first and foremost duty of an Organizer is to organize, supervise and look after his or her society.
- The Co-organizer would assist the Organizer in the day to day business of a Society/Club/Association and act as an Organizer in his/her absence.
- After the announcement of new membership, the Organizer will enlist his/her respective members from the membership forms and give a copy of the list to the concerned office.
- He/she would be responsible to select the cabinet members among the members of his/her respective society on merit keeping in view the past experiences, for one year and inform the office within a week. The Organizers would submit the particulars of their respective cabinet members on the prescribed Performa already handed over to them.
- Organizers would select a person for the cabinet position having one full academic year in a University. No student is eligible for any cabinet position having less than one academic year.

- He/she would chalk out activities for the Session on Wednesdays.
- Meeting of the Cabinet, Society can be called only on Wednesday in order to avoid any disturbance in the curricular activities.
- He/she would be responsible to organize at least two to three mega events.
- He/she would keep a proper record of the activities.
- Each Organizer would seek a prior approval from the Provost for an advance amount for any approved activity. The clearance would be made within a week after completing an event.
- The Central Media Committee has been constituted from the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication under the supervision of a faculty member having a full cabinet. Each media secretary will act as reporter of Central Media Committee.
- Regular reporting of any activity to the office is the responsibility of an Organizer.
- Each Organizer through media secretary will send an advance story to Central Media Committee and Protocol Officer. The Central Media Committee, Protocol Officer of University of Peshawar and the respective Media Secretary of a Society would be responsible for reporting and coverage of an event or activity. They will remain in touch with print and electronic media.
- Any Organizer who does not attend three consecutive official meetings without any valid reason would be relieved from his office/duties.
- The Organizer once appointed will remain in office for one academic year or till the appointment of a new Organizer. However, he/she can submit his resignation after four months on one month prior notice after his/her appointment if he/she so desires.
- At least three meetings of Central Organizing Committee would be called in a year on any Wednesday. Emergency meeting of the committee can be called any time if necessary.
- Inaugural-cum-farewell function would be arranged once in a year for in-coming and out-going cabinets. The Organizers would jointly arrange such a function.
- Each Organizer when required would accompany students or a society on their tour, excursion or any other event. He/she would be entitled to TA/DA permissible under the service rules.
- For any mega event all the Organizers and cabinet members would collectively shoulder the responsibility.
- The Organizers would pinpoint the talented students, keep a record and furnish their information to the office of the Deputy Director. To search, encourage and motivate talented students and keep them busy in healthy constructive activities is the main purpose of running the Societies.
- The Organizer after the end of each session would certify the names of meriting cabinet members or general members for awarding Certificates, Shields and Medals subject to maximum attendance, active participation, excellent performance and meritorious services.
- The Performance of an Organizer would be judged on the basis of his devotion, excellence in planning, organizing and efficiently administrating multiple activities, motivating students for membership, strength of members, order and discipline, punctuality in meetings and function in his/her society.
- The proposed honorarium would be paid to all concerned including the Chief Organizer, Organizers and Co-Organizers on the pattern of proctorial board subject to the approval of the competent authority for his/her additional duties. No person can join two Societies or hold two positions in a Society. However, he/she can join on honorary basis for which he/she would be unable to claim additional honorarium. Simply, a person would be paid honorarium for a single position.

The Central Organizing Committee

- The Central Organizing Committee will include the Provost, Deputy Directors, Chief Organizer, Organizers, Presidents and General Secretaries, Organizers and President of Central Media Committee, Photographer, Multimedia Operator and Sound System Operator.
- At least three meetings in a year would be called to review the work of societies and suggest ways and means for the betterment of the students. Emergency meeting can be called any time if necessary.
- The Provost would act as a Chairman of the Committee. In his absence the Deputy Director would Chair the meeting.

Responsibilities of cabinet members

- There shall be a cabinet for each society headed by the President.
- Recommending the nominees for various portfolios for the cabinet is the responsibility of the Organizer.
- No person is eligible for any cabinet position having less than one Academic year or study courses in a University.
- The whole Cabinet would work collectively as a single body for a society.
- The Cabinet Members would perform their duties mentioned in the “Charter of Students Societies, University of Peshawar”.
- The cabinet members would perform their duties for Academic year or till the appointment of a new cabinet.
- No person can join the cabinet membership of two Societies or two positions in a Society.
- Eighty percent attendance in meetings and functions is required for cabinet members for award of certificates.
- Ten percent concession in attendance will be given to the active participants in their respective academic institutions, Colleges, Departments and Centres.
- Any member of the cabinet can be removed any time for misbehaviour, using un-parliamentary language or violating the rules and Charter.
- The President of a society would be responsible to manage the activities or function of his/her society. He/she will be responsible to his/her Organizer, to chalk out the activities and follow the activities of the academic calendar.
- The Vice President will act as President in the absence of President.
- The General Secretary would keep a proper record of all activities, attendance of the cabinet and general members, minutes of the meetings and keep vigilance on the activities. The General Secretary of a society would submit a copy of attendance to the Deputy Director on the prescribed Performa already provided to them.
- The Joint Secretary will perform the duties of General Secretary in the absence of General Secretary.
- The Finance Secretary would be responsible for financial matters of a society and prepare a case in advance for any activity. He/she will also be responsible to clear the dues within a week.
- The Media Secretary of each society will act as a reporter of Central Media Committee. He/she would send an advance story to Central Media Committee, Protocol officer, Print and Electronic Media on regular basis. He/she will keep a proper record of reports and share a copy of the report to the office. He/she will also be responsible for quarterly issue of his/her society with the collaboration of cabinet members and organizers.
- The Public Relation Secretary (Male and Female) will be responsible for designing, printing and distribution of invitation cards. They must have a list and contact number of invitees faculty members, Administrative Heads and key persons in Public and private sector. They will chalk out the program of their society in advance with mutual consultation of Organizer and cabinet members.
- The four Zonal Representatives will be responsible to distribute/administer any letter, information, invitation, circular or any task given by the society in their respective zones and recollect the information or get feedback from their zones.

10% concession in attendance

The Provost Office, University of Peshawar, has been authorized by the Vice Chancellor to grant relaxation maximum to 10% in attendance for active members of the Students Societies. While granting this concession, it is requested that following rules be strictly observed:

- The application must be forwarded by the President of the Society duly attested by the head of the institute/department where the concerned applicant is enrolled.
- Application must be signed and stamped by the concerned Organizer of the Society and forwarded to the Provost office with comments.
- The name of the applicant must be listed in the membership list maintained by the office of the Students Societies.
- Relaxation to the maximum of 10% shall be determined by the applicant's attendance out of total number of meetings and functions of the concerned society.

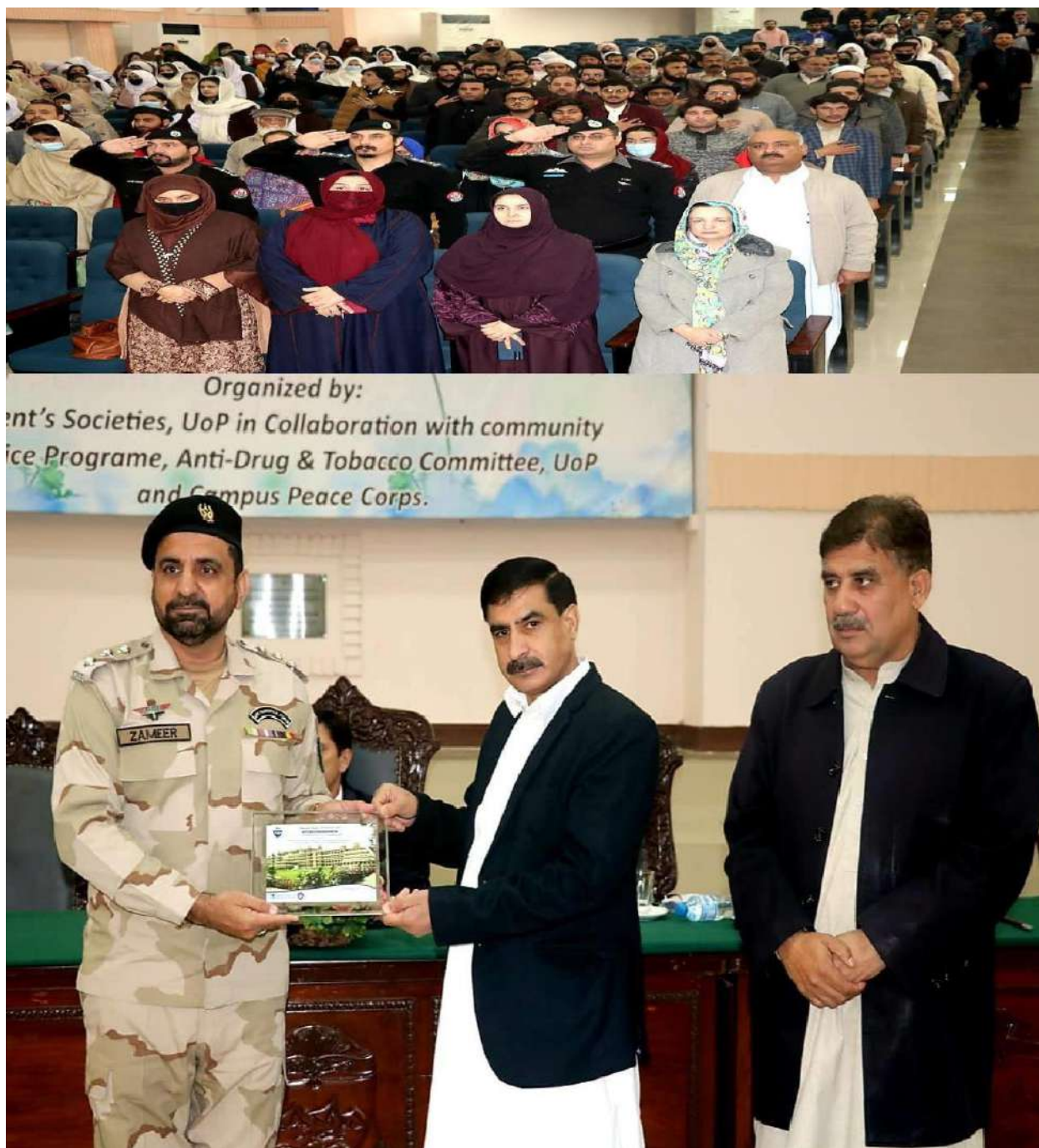
Declamation Contest and Essay Writing Competitions

Students of University of Peshawar visit to Dar-ul-Atfal Orphanage Peshawar

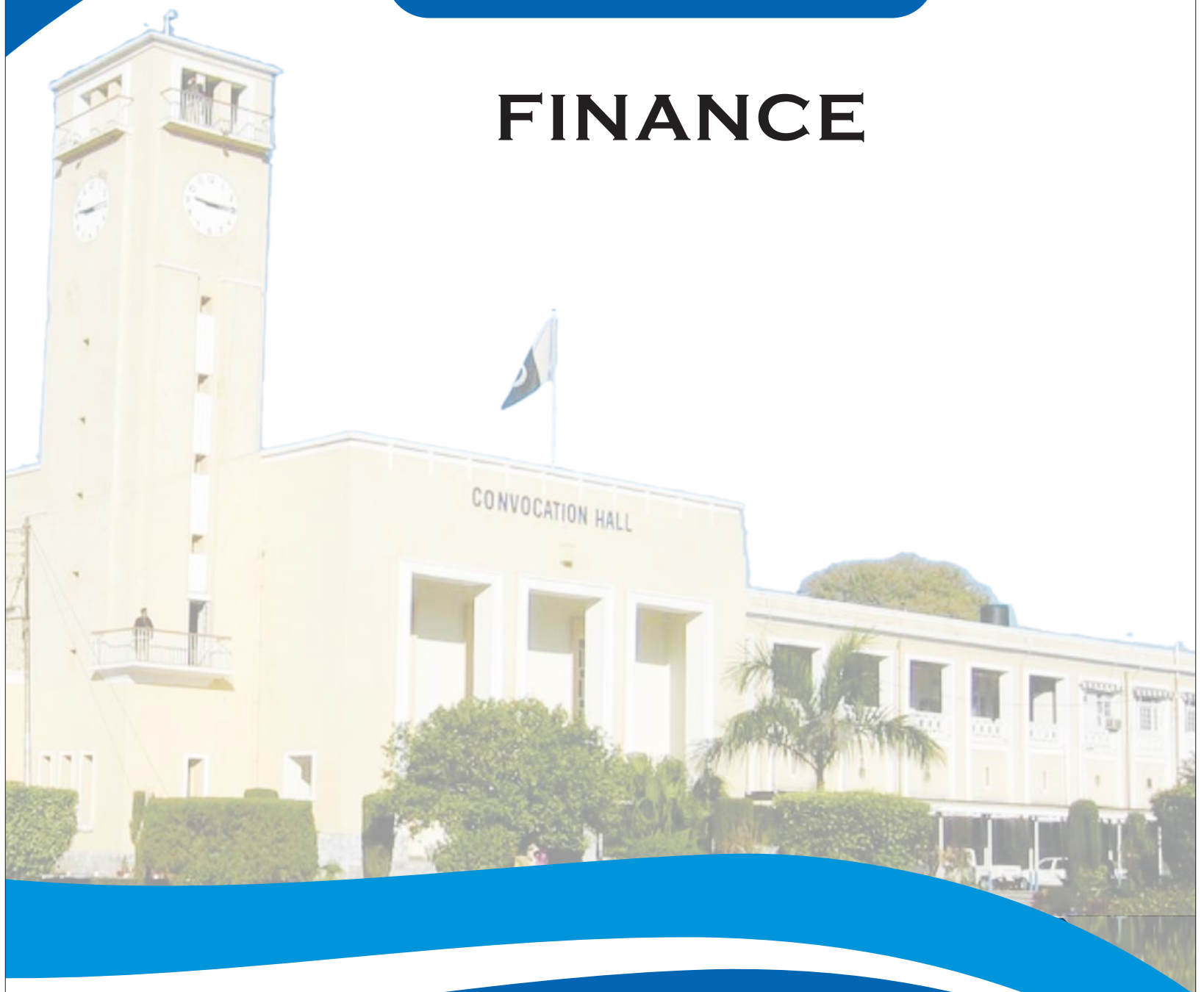

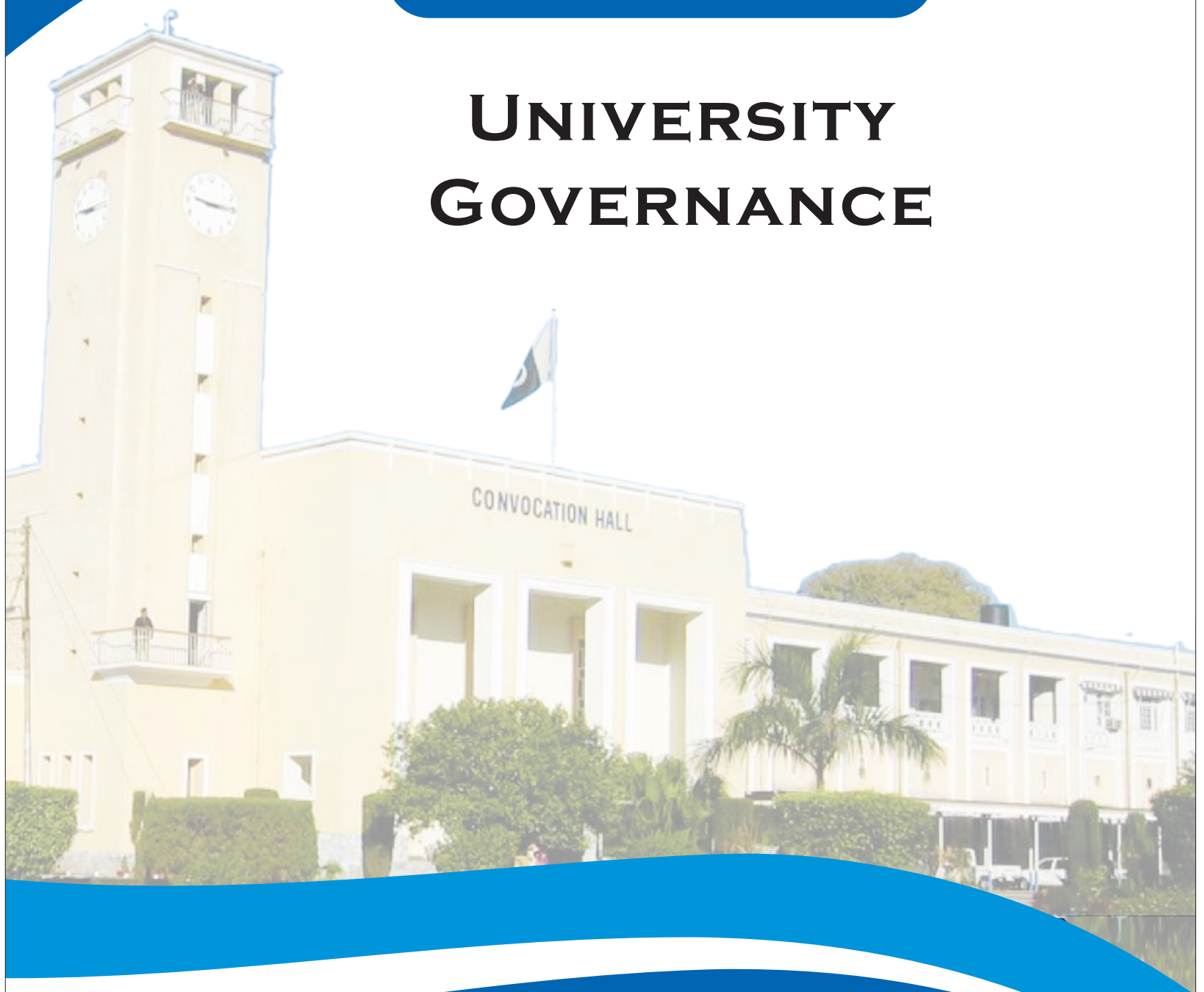

CHAPTER-13

UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE



Overview

The University is governed and managed under the provisions of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Universities Act-2012 (Amended 2016) and the statutes, rules and regulations made there under through various bodies, called authorities. The University Authorities may be classified in two broad Groups:

Authorities established by the Act

1. Senate
2. Syndicate
3. Academic Council

Authorities established by the Statutes

1. Board of Faculty
2. Board of Studies
3. Advanced Studies and Research Board
4. Finance and Planning Committee
5. Selection Board
6. Affiliation Committee
7. Discipline Committee

Senate

The Senate has the power of general supervision over the University and it may hold the authorities accountable for all the functions of the University. The Senate has all powers of the University not expressly vested in an Authority or officer by the University Act. During Academic year 2021-22, the meetings of Senate were held on 14th June 2022 and 30th June 2022.

Syndicate

The Syndicate is the executive body of the University and exercises general supervision over the affairs and management of the University. Seven meetings of the Syndicate were held during academic year 2021-22.

- Meeting No. 437: 7th September 2021(Emergency), Meeting No 438: 27th September 2021. Meeting No 439: 19th December 2021, Meeting No.440: 15th April 2022, Meeting No. 441: 10th May 2022,
- Meeting 442: 7th June 2022, Meeting No. 443: 21st June 2022.

Academic Council

The Academic Council is the principal academic body of the University and has powers to lay down proper standards of instruction, research and examinations and to regulate and promote the academic life of the University and the colleges. The Academic Council meeting was held on 1st September 2021.

4. Selection Board:

The Selection Board considers the applications received in response to advertisements and recommends to the Syndicate the names of suitable candidates for appointment to teaching and other posts in BPS-17 and above. During Academic year 2021-22, the meeting of the Selection Boarding was held on 20th & 21st, 26th & 27th April 2022.

5. Finance and Planning Committee:

The functions of the Finance and Planning Committee includes considering annual statement of accounts, annual and revised budget estimates, to review periodically the financial position of the University and to advise the Syndicate on all matters relating to the planning, development, finances, investments and accounts of the University. During Academic year 2021-22, the meetings of the Finance and Planning Committee were held on 2nd November 2021 and 27th May 2022.

6. Affiliation Committee

The functions of the Affiliation Committee are to inspect the educational institutions seeking affiliation with, or admission to the privileges of the University and to inquire into complaints alleging breach of conditions of affiliation by affiliated colleges and to advise the Academic Council thereon. The meeting of the Finance and Planning Committee was held on 23rd December 2021.

CHAPTER-14

HEALTH CENTRE / MEDICAL FACILITIES



Medical Facilities



Building of the University Health Centre, University Campus, University of Peshawar

University Health Centre is a constituent part of the University, established in 1961 in the premises of University Campus with the aim to provide doorstep health facilities on the Campus. The Centre provides out-patient health facilities to the employees, their families and children as well as to the female students of the departments, institutes, research centres, colleges, schools etc. of the University as well as to other sister universities situated on the campus which includes Islamia College University of Engineering & Technology, Agriculture University, Khyber Medical College, Khyber College of Dentistry, etc. Further, in case of emergency, the patients are also examined at their place of residence/ incident. Moreover, ambulance facility is also available at the campus.

One of the main responsibilities of the Centre is to furnish medical reports which are required by the University for processing medical re-imbursement cases of the employees and their families. In case of medical leave/reimbursement cases of the employees of the University, medical report/advice/expert opinion given by this Centre or by Medical Board (of which the Medical Officer of the Centre is a member) is considered as official report, which highlights medical aspects of the case, and facilitates the University Authorities in decision making. Moreover, consultation services of the Centre are always available to University, of which the Centre feels pleasure to extend.

1. Vaccination Services are provided by one male and one female vaccinationators at the Unvierity Health Centre which are deputed by Health Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. B.C.G PCV 10, DPT OPV, IPV, Rota, Virus, Measle (I+II) are availbale for infants and toddlers. For road accidents (RTA) and antenatal patients, T.T are availbale. University Health Centre has all type of Covid Vaccine for adults. Moreover measles campaign, typhold campaign are conducted from time to time.

2. Timings

Office timings: 08:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.

Besides office timing, in case of emergency, the patients are also examined at residence of the doctor, which is located adjacent to the Centre at University Campus.

3. Status of the University Health Centre

University Health Centre is basically a dispensary and meant for out-patient only.

4. Consultation

Staff, their families and children of different universities on the campus visit the centre for consultation during office timings.

5. Ante-natal Checkups

Regular ante-natal checkup is done and its record is maintained by the Centre throughout pregnancy duration. Ultrasound facility is also available for Ante-Natal patients.

6. Deliveries

All ante - natal and post-natal checkups are done, however, deliveries are not attended at the Centre. Patients who want to get delivered at their home, L.H.V .and Dai services are provided at their residence (by call). Patients are also allowed to visit Kulsoom Maternity Home, Dr. Johar Clinic, CMH and other government hospitals and their charges are reimbursed by the University.

7. Post-Natal Checkup

Patients who are delivered at their home, if they need post-natal checkup L.H.Vs and Dais visit these patients at their home for post-natal care.

8. Vaccination

Services of tow male and one female vaccinators are available at the Centre who are deputed by Health Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Vaccination for tuberculosis, diphtheria, pertussis, hepatitis, tetanus and polio is done. Polio drops are administered to the children up to the age of 5 years on regular basis. Rota vaccination is also given to children.

9. Dressings and Minor Surgery etc.

Facilities of dressings and minor surgery etc. in case of abscess drains, burns, wounds cuts etc. are available at the Centre. However, in complicated cases the patients are referred to hospitals like Khyber Teaching Hospital etc. Injections and drips prescribed by private doctors are not entertained because of complication i.e. reactions etc. Only those injections are entertained which are prescribed by the Doctor of University Health Centre.

10. Minor Tests

BP Sugar, Pregnancy Test, Urine for Sugar and Albumin, Ultrasound are offered only to ante-natal patients.

11. Medicine

Medical Allowance is given to the University employees in their pay, therefore, in the Centre, only emergency medicines are given to patients.

12. Laboratory Test

Employees and their families shall be entitled for free laboratory tests subject to the production of proper prescription slip which is provided by the Centre. The University established a diagnostic laboratory in the Centre of Biotechnology and Microbiology which provide free of cost diagnostic services to the University employees.



Counselling for Stress Reduction at Department of Psychology

The Department of Psychology is providing clinical services successfully running many academic programs along with the clinical services. Dr. Erum Irshad is the incharge of the psychology clinic at the Department which has three units; Assessment and Psychotherapeutic services unit, Autism Unit and the Speech therapy Unit. It is a normal part of our lives to experience stress, depression, anxiety etc. from time to time but sometimes we need professional help, so the department of Psychology has taken this initiative to provide services not only to the students, faculty, and administrative staff but also to the general community. The Assessment and Psychotherapeutic Unit has facilities to diagnose psychological issues and deliver therapies for a variety of mental issues. The Autism Unit has developed significantly in a very short period of time and provides play therapy, behavioural therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy among others to the admitted children. The Speech Therapy Unit deals with the clients experiencing communication and language disorders. World Mental Health day was celebrated on 10, October, 2021 with the arrangement of a free mental health camp for everyone to help raise awareness and understanding of mental health problems and their treatment. In addition to the provision of these services the Department is training therapists in clinical psychology and speech therapy. Under the leadership of Dr. Erum Irshad the Department Signed MOU with GIZ, Germany for a project focused on the psychological and emotional wellbeing of host communities during covid 19 pandemic on 9th, June, 2021. The department of Psychology has also signed an MOU with Social Welfare Department on 17th, June, 2021. Another MOU has been signed with University of Engineering and Technology on 12th, December, 2021.







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
