

F.Sc. PROGRAM

College of Home Economics has started the F.Sc. program in 2010, with 150 seats. The criterion for admission is Matriculationor O' levels with at least 45% marks. The courses of F.Sc. will be the same, which are offered by Board of Intermediate and Secondary EducationPeshawar. The F.Sc sectio is facilitated with well equipped laboratories and highly qualified staff.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

Atested photocopies of the following documents with admission forms are essentialfor the candidate to be considered for admission:

- 2. Domicile Certif ate of the applicant.

BS PROGRAMS

BS program is a four year program comprising eight semesters.

College of Home Economics is offering admissions in BS Home Economics program in six disciplines .i.e.

- Art and Design
- Food and Nutrition Sciences
- Interior and Environmental Design
- Human Development and Family Studies
- Resource and facility management
- Textiles & Clothing

Further, the following BS programs are also offered

- Human Nutrition and Dietetics
- Public Health
- Fashion Design
- Human Development & family Studies
- Interier Design

ADMISSION TO BS PROGRAMS

Students are eligible for admission in Bs1 after F.A/F.Sc. However, in BS Home Economomics the first four semesters cover compulsory and foundation courses, while from the fifth semester students have the option of selecting from the fields mentioned above, i.e. Art and Design, Interior and , Environmental Design Human Development and Family Studies, Food and Nutrition Sciences, Resource and facility Management, Textiles and Clothing.

For admission in BS V,(Home Economics) Students are required to give three preferences (areas of specialization). Students will get admission on the basis of these preferences depending on

- 1. The availability of seats in that area.
- 2. Entry Test (if required)
- 3. CGPA. Decision of the Admission Committee will be considered as final.

OBJECTIVES:

The BS program aims at:

- Enabling the students to learn a wide variety of courses in their relevant fields.
- Providing specialized fields under the umbrella of Home Economics.
- Enabling the students to become academically compatible with foreign standards.

Salient Features of Home Economics Curriculum are as Follows:

- 1. The curriculum has been designed for the semester system of examination.
- 2. This curriculum is designed to fulfill the requirements for four year B.S Home Economics designed at National Curriculum Revision Committee, of HEC in Lahore.
- 3. This curriculum gives the option for specialization in any of the six areas of predesigned courses of Home Economics.
- 4. The first two years include all the Compulsory, Foundation and General courses. The Majors and Electives, and General courses are placed in the last two years of BS Program. In order to provide more focused training in relevant professions, students can choose any one field from the above mentioned areas and would study all the major and selected elective major courses from the relevant area. In addition to being trained as teachers and researchers, all the students are also trained to work in other relevant professions (few examples are given below):

M.PHIL PROGRAM

The College of Home Economics, University of Peshawar has the honor to start first ever M.Phil Program in Home Economics, in Pakistan. The commencement of M.Phil (Home Economics) program at the College of Home Economics, University of Peshawar, is a remarkable achievement not only for the College of Home Economics, but also for the University of Peshawar and the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province. The M.Phil in Home Economics program is offered simultaneously in five areas of Home Economics. These include:

- Art and Design
- Human Development and Family Studies
- Food and Nutrition Sciences
- Resource and Facility Management
- Textiles and Clothing

AIM

To provide opportunity of higher studies in Home Economics disciplines in the University of Peshawar to facilitate acquisition of higher learning and qualifications in the field of Home Economics.

PROGRAM FEATURES

• M.Phil. program comprises four semesters, having a coursework of 24 credit hours.

PH. D PROGRAM

The Ph.D in Home Economics Program is offered simultaneously in five Home Economics disciplines namely:

- Art and Design
- Human Development and Family Studies
- Food and Nutrition Sciences
- Resource and Facility management
- Textiles and Clothing

PROGRAM FEATURES

Ph.D. program consist of six semesters, having a coursework of 24 credit hours.



CHIEF PROCTOR

Chief proctor has the following responsibilities:

- To implement the disciplinary rules (that are mentionedbelow) of the college and make the students observe them strictly.
- To oversee the overall behavior and uniform of the students in the college premises.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- A student is required to atend punctually all the specified credit hours for lectures and hours designated for demonstrations and prractals. Irregular students will be strictly dealt with according to rules.
- Repeated absence from lectures, practial class, demonstratons and seminars may lead to expulsion from the College or heavily fined.
- Seventy-Five percent (75%) atendance is required as a minimum to appear in the examination. In all cases, leave taken will be at the student's own risk. Even a medical certif ate will not cover a deficiency in aaendance percentage required. Shortage of atendance (less than 75%) will certainly deprive a student of her right to appear in the final examinaatioand she will have to repeat the same class with a loss of one year.
- All students are to be present in all the functions, sermons, lectures etc. of the College. Before gathering in the Hall atendance will be taken by the teacher proctor. Students who remain absent will have to pay a fine of Rs.1000/- per event.
- For absence on Friday, fine of Rs. 1000/- will be

levied.

- A College identitycard with photograph will have to be produced by the student before entering the Annual ExaminationHall in order to prove that she:
 - i. Is on roll at College of Home Economics during the academic year preceding the examination.
 - ii. Has atended about 75% of the full course lectures delivered during that academic year (both theory and practial).
- All dates and deadlines officially y notif by the Principal for different purposes e.g. admission dues, examinaton dues, submission of assignments etc. shall be strictly observed by the students. Late fee shall be paid in case final deadline is not met.
- Students are required to arrive at official opening timings, in case of Late coming they shall be fined Rs.500 for 1st day, and Rs.100 shall be
- added for consecuti e days if so.

LEAVE APPLICATION

- Only those leave applications will be acknowledged and entertained which are signed by one of the parents.
- Short leave are not allowed. In case of prior commitments, appointment or any other reasons, the students shall take a whole day off on that day.



DISCIPLINE

- Moreover, photocopy of the parent's ID card is to be atached with the application.
- Students should stay at home on the day they
 have an appointment with doctor as short leave
 for routine appointment is not granted.

A short leave is granted only in case of dire emergency on the following terms and conditions.

- When parents will come to pick them up.
- When parents will produce a copy of their ID card.
- When the application will be signed y the class staff proctors
- The brothers, sisters and other relatives are not allowed to pick the students from the college during its working time.

GENERAL CONDUCT

- Students are to be held responsible for the repair and replacement of any college owned property's damage or misplacement.
- Students are not allowed to order food from outside during college hours.
- Discipline is to be maintained in the canteen.
 Regular rounds are taken by the staffmembers to ensure the discipline and fine the bunkers.
- Students should exhibit decent behavior during college timings in classes and gounds. They will be fined in case of misconduct.
- Student should avoid class bunking otherwise a fine of Rs. 500/- will have to be paid for each missed lecture.
- Misbehavior with the Principal, teachers, fellow students, peons, drivers and clerical sta ffwill be severely dealt with. The offender will either be

- heavily fined or apstain from aaending classes for a specific timperiod.
- Students are required to submit an Affidavit on a stamp paper duly signed by the oath commissioner, to ensure no particip atioof the student in any kind of politi al activiti in the college premises.
- Students found guilty of using unfair means or involved in any other fraudulent activity will either be rusti ated or fined heavily.
- Cameras, mobile phones, MP3s etc. are strictly prohibited and will be confiscated and fine of Rs. 5000/- will be levied. The parents shall be asked to meet sta ffproctors in this regard at the end of the session.
- Simple and Non Android Phones are allowed for security reasons to students. Students are provided phone facility in the Principal's office for necessary phone calls afer signing permission slips from staffproctor.
- No visitors or giftsare allowed to be received at the College gate.
- Fund raising for any commercial or social cause without Principal's prior permission is prohibited
- Students found involved in any verbal or physical aggressive activitie like fighting etc shall be strictly punished.

UNIFORM RULES

Students should strictly follow the following rules regarding uniform:

- Students are required to wear the prescribed uniform.
 - The uniform should be clean, properly ironed and shoes well-polished.



DISCIPLINE

- All kind of jewelry is prohibited, these items will be confiscated and a fine of Rs. 100/- per item will be levied.
- Violation of uniform rules even in minor items is punishable by fine as well as confiscacatiof the prohibited item.
- All college students in whatsoever program are required to wear proper uniform of the color and design approved by the College Uniform Committee.
- All Students must possess their College ID cards during College timings.

HOSTEL DISCIPLINE

- Rooms in the hostel are to be kept clean and tid.
- Boarders must observe hostel rules and regulationsstrictly.
- Study hours must be adhered to.
- Hostel peace is not to be disturbed by playing Loud Music.
- Boarders should produce an application for leave already signed by the warden in case of any short leave from College, otherwise it will stand unacceptable.
- Boarders are not allowed to leave (exit from) the College by using the College Gate. They can only exit (with permission), from the hostel gate.
- The day scholars are not allowed to enter the hostel by using the small common gate, in case of violation, the student shall be suspended for a specific period.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Learning and educaton is supported by the academic programs through co-curricular activities. Conferences and workshops are held at nationaland

internationallevel. Eminent scholars and resource persons are invited to deliver extension lectures, hold workshops and seminars on a variety of important subjects of general interest involving staff and students at graduate and the postgraduate level. Important days of national international interest are also observed.

Various activities related to the subject of Home Economics are planned and carried out throughout the year, arranged by the students association.It comprises the following societies:

- Religious and National Afairs Society
- Creative Art Society
- Cultural & Dramatic Society
- Science Society
- Sports Society

The college calendar plans the curricular and co curricular events of the whole year at the outset of the session, thus, ensuring systematc order of things. In this way, the students enjoy a full academic session with adequate co curricular functions and activitie The students work in the various societies to help, plan and conduct functions including competions in flower arrangement, poster and card-making, food preparation, designing, dress and hairstyles for various occasions etc. English and Urdu Declamation and Debates, Quiz, Qirat and Naat-Khawani competition Recreation Day are also held every year. Extension lectures on informati e topics and ones related to their age are also arranged for providing proper guidance. Talented Girls Gatherings are arranged at nationallevel. Students are also encouraged to

participate in co-curricular activities and sports events at provincial and nationallevel.

In order to open up new vistas for our graduates, we have started to inspire, educate, and train our students towards entrepreneurship so that they are able to establish themselves as independent entrepreneurs and set up their own enterprises for self-employment, job creaton, and income generation.
