

**Undergraduate Admissions – Fall 2026
FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

1. When were undergraduate admissions announced?

Undergraduate admissions for Fall 2026 were announced on 10th June 2026.

2. What is/was the last date for submitting an online application?

The last date for online submission of applications is 20th July 2026.

3. Is there any possibility of an extension in the application deadline?

Usually, the application deadline is not extended. Applicants should not wait for a possible extension and must submit their applications within the announced deadline.

However, the University may extend the closing date in exceptional circumstances.

4. Can an application be submitted after the closing date?

No. Applications cannot be submitted after the closing date unless the University formally announces an extension.

5. How many programme choices may an applicant select?

An applicant may select a maximum of four programme choices, subject to the prescribed eligibility requirements.

6. Can programme choices be changed after submission of the application?

Programme choices cannot ordinarily be changed once the application form has been submitted. However, an applicant may submit a request to helpdesk.oas@uop.edu.pk, supported by a valid and convincing justification. Such requests will be considered by the University on a case-by-case basis and shall not create any entitlement.

7. What is the application processing fee and testing fee?

The prescribed processing fee is Rs. 2,600, comprising the University's application-processing and admission-testing charges.

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION TEST

8. When will the admission test be held?

The test will be held on Sunday, 2nd August 2026.

9. What is the reporting time?

Candidates must report to their designated test centres at 8:00 a.m. Candidates are advised to arrive on time to complete the necessary entry formalities.

10. How will candidates receive their roll numbers and test-centre details?

Roll numbers, test centres, test groups and related instructions will be made available through University official website (i.e., www.uop.edu.pk).

11. What should a candidate bring to the test centre?

Candidates should bring:

- Printed roll-number slip
- Original CNIC or Form-B
- Blue or black pen
- Any other document specified in the test instructions

12. What are the admission-test groups?

Candidates will appear in the relevant test group according to their Intermediate level academic background:

13. What will be the level of the admission test?

The test will be based on the Intermediate-level syllabus relevant to the candidate's test group.

14. Where can candidates obtain the test contents and sample paper?

The test contents, sample paper and instructions are available on the University of Peshawar website.

TEST PATTERN AND MARKING

15. How many questions will the test contain?

The test will contain 50 multiple-choice questions.

16. How many answer choices will each question have?

Each question will have four answer choices, of which only one will be correct.

17. What will be the total marks of the test?

The test will carry a total of 50 marks.

18. How much time will be allowed for the test?

Candidates will be allowed 60 minutes. No additional time will be granted.

19. How many marks will be awarded for a correct answer?

Each correct answer will carry one mark.

20. Is there any negative marking?

No. There will be no negative marking.

21. Should candidates attempt all questions?

Candidates are advised to attempt all questions because there is no negative marking.

They should read every question carefully and manage their time appropriately.

BUBBLE SHEET INSTRUCTIONS

22. Where should candidates record their answers?

Answers must be recorded only on the bubble sheet provided at the examination centre.

Answers marked on the test paper will not be evaluated.

23. Which pen should be used on the bubble sheet?

Candidates must use only a blue or black pen.

24. How should an answer be marked?

The appropriate bubble must be filled completely and neatly. Candidates should mark only one answer for each question.

25. What happens if more than one answer is marked?

Multiple responses to a question will be treated as incorrect.

26. What should a candidate do if the test paper or bubble sheet is damaged or incomplete?

The candidate must immediately inform the invigilator before beginning the examination if any page is missing, damaged or illegible, or if there is any discrepancy in the test paper or bubble sheet.

EXAMINATION CENTER DISCIPLINE

27. Are electronic devices allowed in the examination hall?

No. Possession or use of unauthorized electronic devices or other prohibited material is strictly forbidden.

28. Can candidates communicate with one another during the test?

No. Communication with other candidates during the examination is strictly prohibited.

29. What action may be taken in case of impersonation or misconduct?

Impersonation, communication, use of unauthorized material or electronic devices, and any other misbehaviour may result in cancellation of the examination under the University of Peshawar Examination Discipline Regulations, 2025.

30. What should candidates do when the test time ends?

Candidates must immediately stop marking answers, remain seated and submit both the test paper and bubble sheet to the invigilator before leaving the examination hall.

31. Can a candidate take the test paper or bubble sheet outside the examination hall?

No. Both the test paper and bubble sheet must be returned to the invigilator.

RESULTS AND MERIT LISTS

32. When will the admission-test result be announced?

The result is expected to be processed after the test and uploaded to the admission portal on 3rd August 2026, subject to official confirmation.

33. How can a candidate submit a complaint regarding the test result?

Candidates will be provided two days to submit result-related complaints through helpdesk.oas@uop.edu.pk. Complaints received after the prescribed period may not be entertained.

34. Does passing the admission test guarantee admission?

No. Admission depends on merit, programme eligibility, availability of seats, applicable quotas and fulfilment of all prescribed requirements.

35. How will admission merit be calculated?

Admission merit will be calculated using the following weightage:

- a. SSC/Matric: 20%
- b. HSSC/Intermediate: 30%
- c. Undergraduate Admission Test: 50%

36. How will merit be calculated if the HSSC result is awaited?

Merit will be calculated on the basis of first-year marks. It will not be revised after declaration of the final result.

37. Is admission based on first-year marks final?

No. It will remain provisional. Candidates who fail HSSC or do not meet the minimum eligibility criteria will lose their admission, and their fee will be refunded under university policy.

38. How will merit lists be displayed?

Provisional and Final merit lists will be displayed through the University official website i.e. www.uop.edu.pk

39. What is the purpose of a provisional merit list?

The provisional merit list allows candidates to verify their information and report admissible errors within the notified period.

40. Can information be corrected after issuance of the final merit list?

Ordinarily, no correction will be allowed after issuance of the final merit list. Candidates must report genuine discrepancies during the provisional merit-list stage.

41. Can a revised DMC or programme change be accepted after the final merit list?

No. Revised DMCs and changes in programme choices are not allowed after the closing date.

42. What should a selected candidate do after appearing on a merit list?

The candidate shall appear in Concerned Department before Departmental Admission Committee with required documents and deposit the admission fee within the stated deadline. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of the offered seat.

QUOTAS, SPORTS TRIALS AND CLASSES

43. Will applicants for the sports quota undergo trials?

Yes. Sports trials are scheduled from 3rd to 8th August 2026. Applicants must follow the schedule and instructions issued by the Directorate of Sports.

44. What is required for admission against a quota?

Applicants must present relevant documentary evidence at the admission interview to prove their quota eligibility.

45. Are admissions against reserved quotas automatically granted?

No. Quota applicants must fulfil the general eligibility criteria as well as the documentary and procedural requirements of the relevant quota.

46. When will classes commence?

Classes for the Fall 2026 semester are expected to commence before 1 September 2026. The exact date will be officially notified.

47. Where should candidates check for authentic updates?

Candidates should regularly check the official University of Peshawar website (www.uop.edu.pk) and officially verified University communication platforms. Information circulated through unofficial sources should not be relied upon.

GENERAL INFORMATION

48. Is LAT compulsory for admission to LLB?

Yes. Passing the Law Admission Test (LAT) is compulsory.

49. What happens if fewer than 15 students are admitted to a programme?

Admission to that programme will be cancelled.

50. Are all admissions provisional?

Yes. Admissions remain subject to verification of documents, transcripts and compliance with University rules.

51. What happens if an applicant provides false information?

False, incorrect or concealed information will result in disqualification or cancellation of admission.

52. Can the University withdraw or modify a programme?

Yes. The University may withdraw a programme or amend its rules and courses where necessary.

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
